We know of no better location for a general supply store than at Chadwick, as it is twenty-eight miles to Springfield, and as the produce of the farmers for a distance of seventy-five miles south of Springfield has to be freighted with teams to Springfield, and a large per cent. of that produce passes through Chadwick, because Chadwick is without a general supply house, where they could exchange their cash and produce for other commodities.

The railroad company has 160 acres of land platted into town lots, and will sell these lots cheap to all who will build either business houses or residences on them.
