
Sports

Chadwick has one major sport, basketball. The 1953-'54 season has been most successful for Chadwick.

This successful season has brought us in another trophy third place at Branson. In our first game at Branson we ran over Hollister by a score of 68-55 with Gary Rozell and Johnny Payne taking high point honors with 24 and 22 points respectively. We were not so victorious in the second game by losing to the powerful Branson ball club, 56-77.
