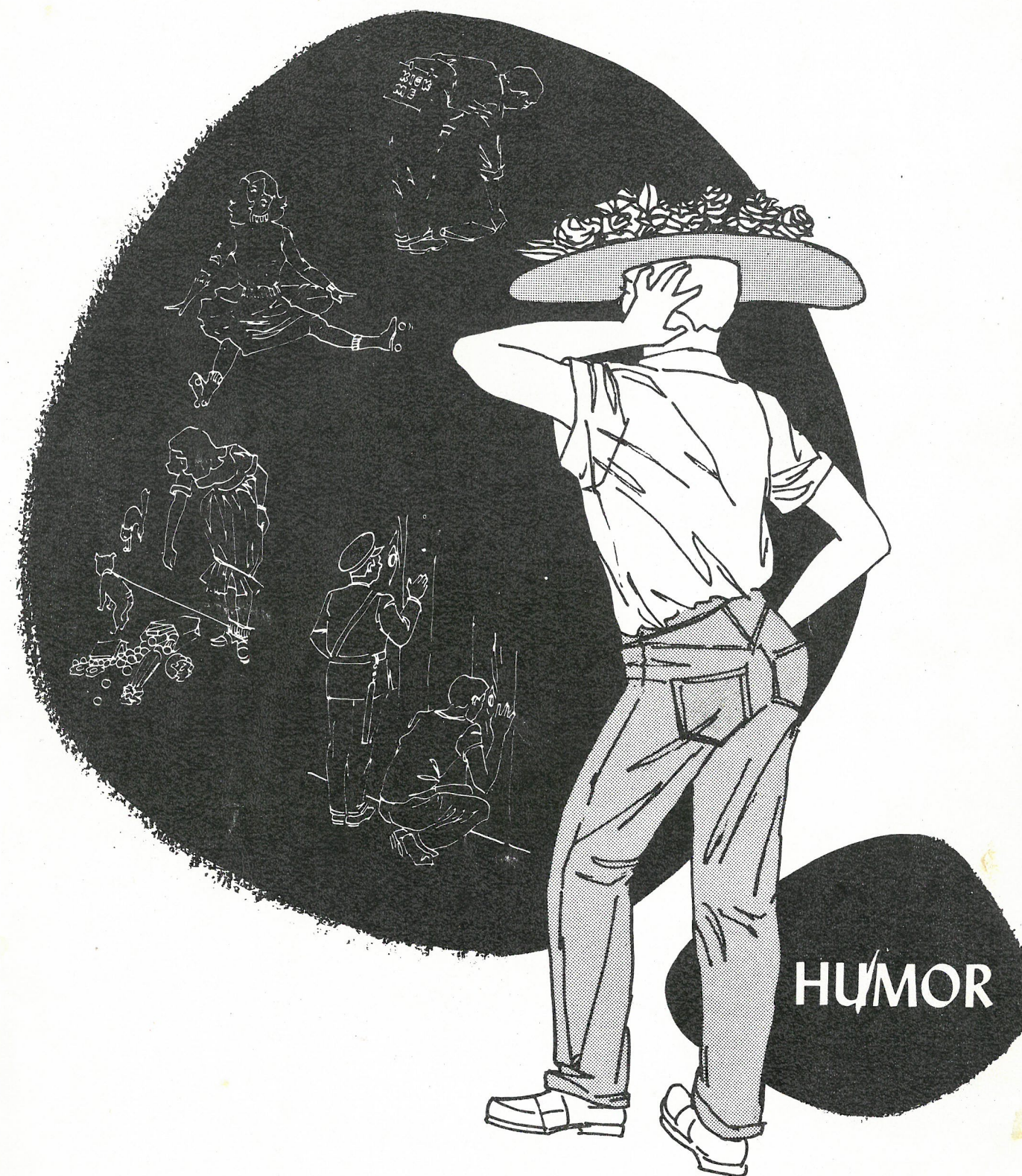
## Sports

Chadwick has one major sport, basketball. The 1953-'54 season has been most successful for Chadwick.

This successful season has brought us in another trophy third place at Branson. In our first game at Branson we ran over Hollister by a score of 68-55 with Gary Rozell and Johnny Payne taking high point honors with 24 and 22 points respectively. We were not so victorious in the second game by losing to the powerful Branson ball club, 56-77. In the third game we romped over Forsyth with a fourth quarter rally 51-45, Joe Rozell took top scoring honors with 17 points.

Chadwick romped over the Springfield Bullpups by the score of 78-37. The Cardinals were unbeaten on their home floor this year, they have won twelve games and lost five.
