






SENIORS


The class decided on the Monterey Restaurant in Springfield as the scene of the Banquet. Everyone seemed to have a very enjoyable evening.

Our high school education is something that will shine through out the years to come. Our final hope is that you who follow will be able to realize and appreciate the true advantage of attaining an education.


