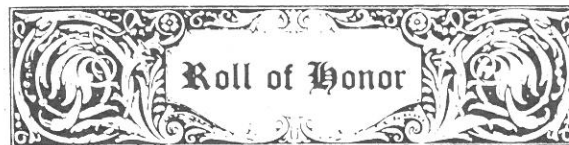

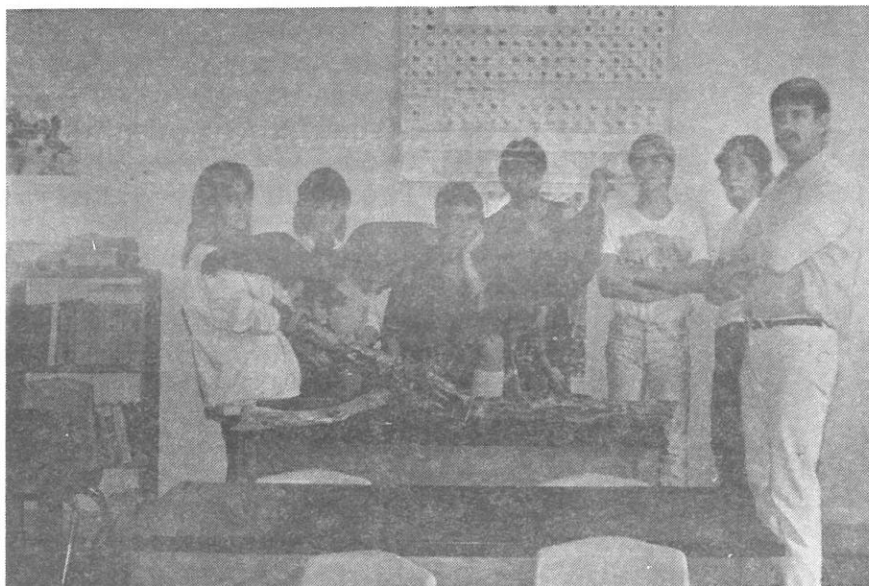

The museum was begun on School of the Ozarks campus in the 1930's and has continued to develop and improve over the years. The museum was originally housed in what was formerly a boys dormitory built in 1917, and was originally named the Good Museum, in honor of School of the Ozarks long-time president, Dr. Robert M. Good.

The museum includes many displays of historic artifacts, and collections acquired from various contributors to the museum.

In the museum there is a 'Hall of Wildlife' which contains a collection of game animals from around the world, a 'Hall of weapons' including a Smith and Wesson handgun display, and also a 'Greater Ozarks hall of fame'.

The museum also includes many other interesting displays that were viewed by the history classes.

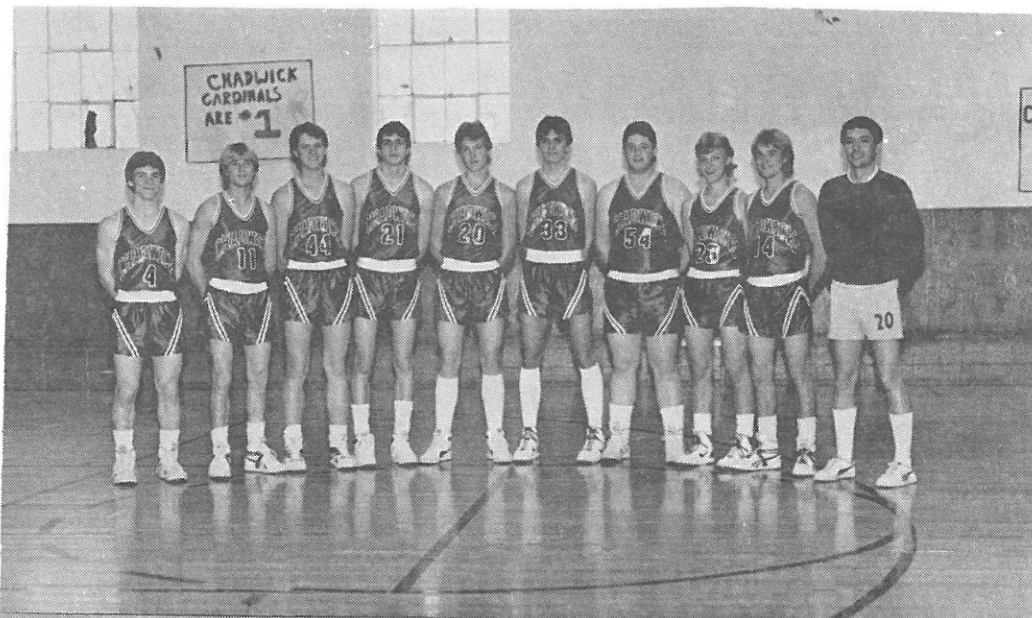
# Spirit Dance

Did you dress up to show your spirit during Spirit Week? Well if you did the cheerleaders thank you for your support and if you didn't dress up, you should have.

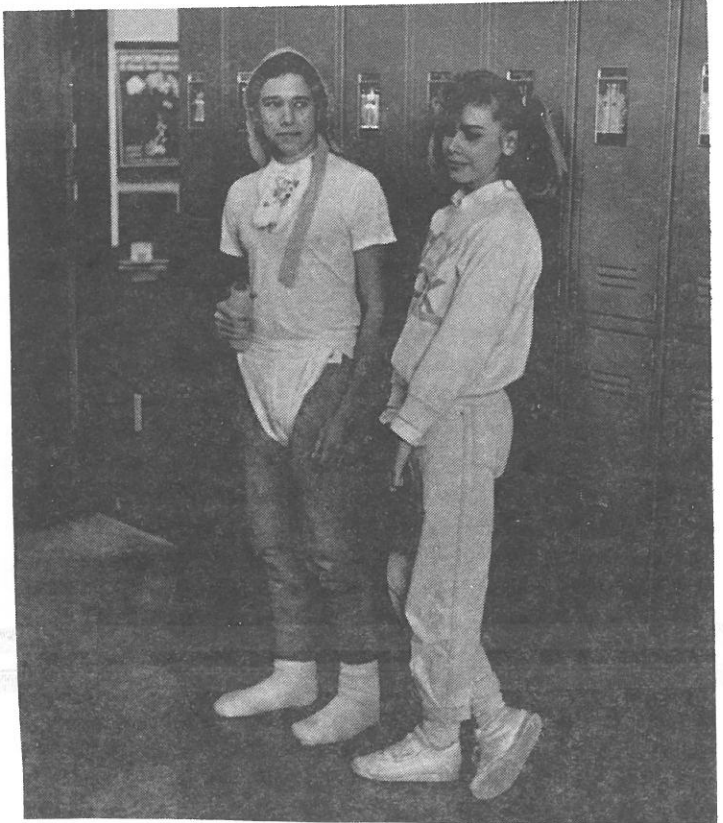
Many of the CHS students did dress up to show their spirit. Most of the CHS faculty and student body agreed that Mike Massey's costume on Little Kids Day was the best.

Grade school students who dressed up received bubble gum for each day they dressed up. Winners from each room received a balloon of a stick.

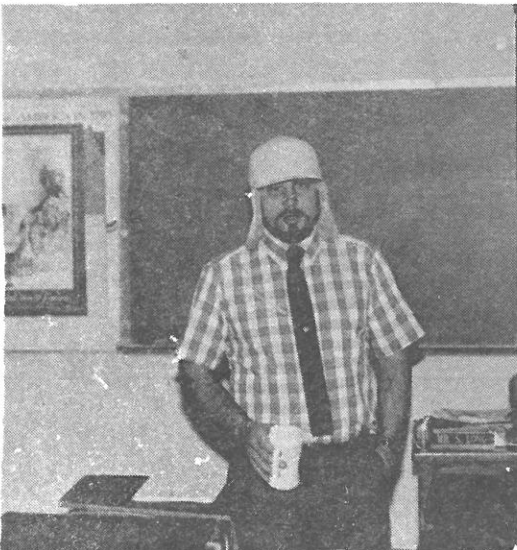
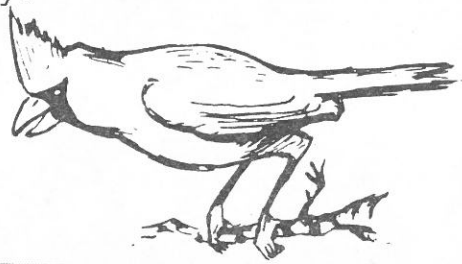

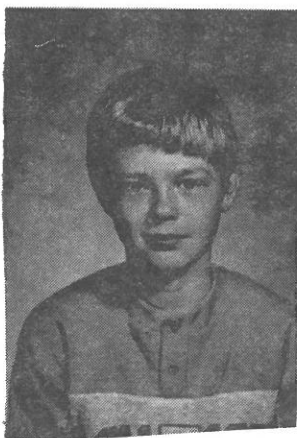
# Special Education
