

1987-88 school year. Time spent with friends has made this year one to remember. But with classes, homework, and extra-curricular activities there was little idle time.



Chadwick Cardinals made HEADS TURN with a successful season in volleyball, basketball, softball, and baseball.




The Varsity Boys Basketball Team placed first in the Forsyth and Spokane Tournament and Third in the Norwood Tournament.

All this came through hard work and dedication. Team members and coaches spent hours in practice determined to make it to the top. The team's record for the year is one to be proud of.




















Looking back at some of the highlights, we feel assured that we were RISING TO NEW HEIGHTS!



It was great year in sports and everyone that participated is appreciated. Congratulations to the Varsity Volleyball and the Varsity Basketball teams for taking first in conference.






