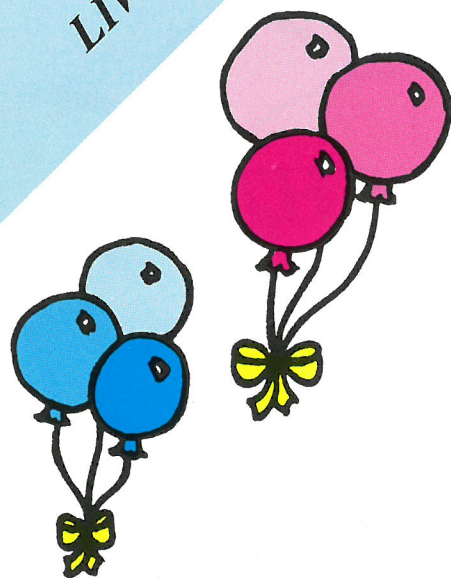

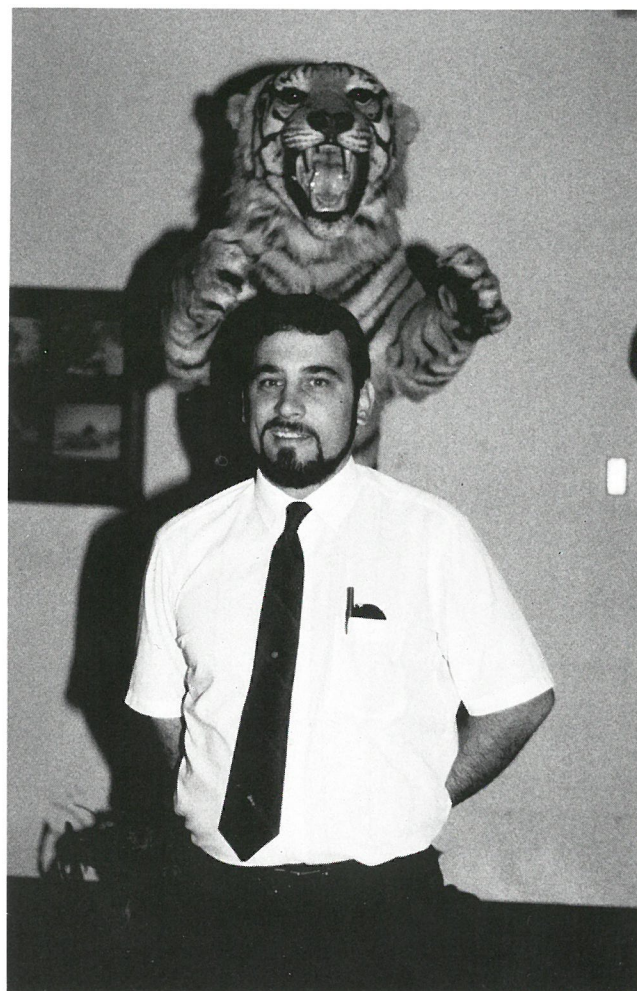

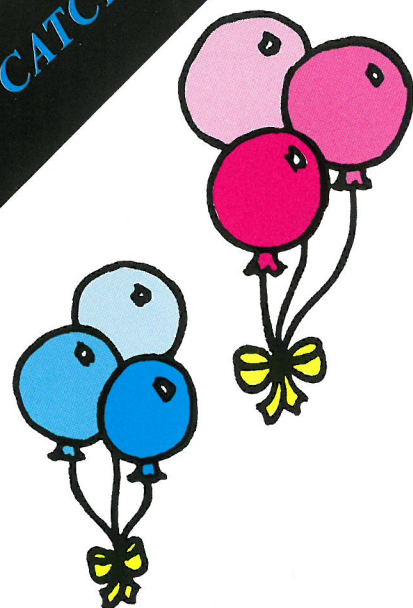


RISING TO NEW HEIGHTS,

 was little idle time.



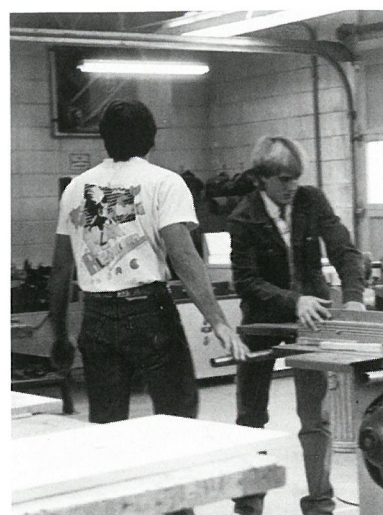

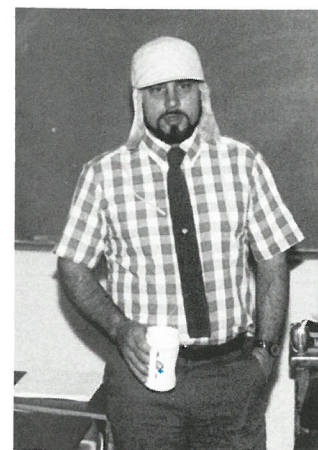
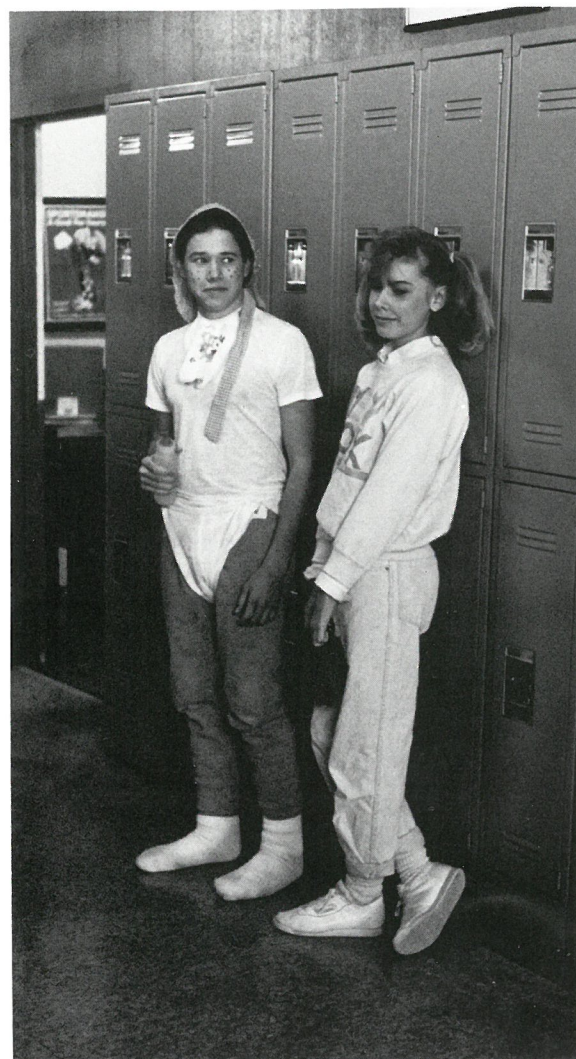


Chadwick Cardinals made HEADS TURN with a successful season in volleyball, basketball, softball, and baseball.

All this came through hard work and dedication. Team members and coaches spent hours in practice determined to make it to the top. The team's record for the year is one to be proud of.



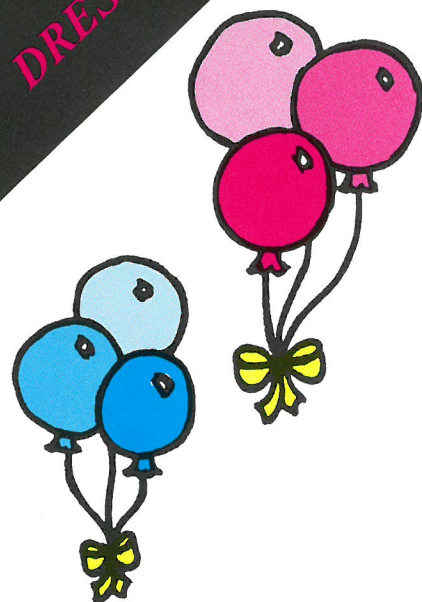

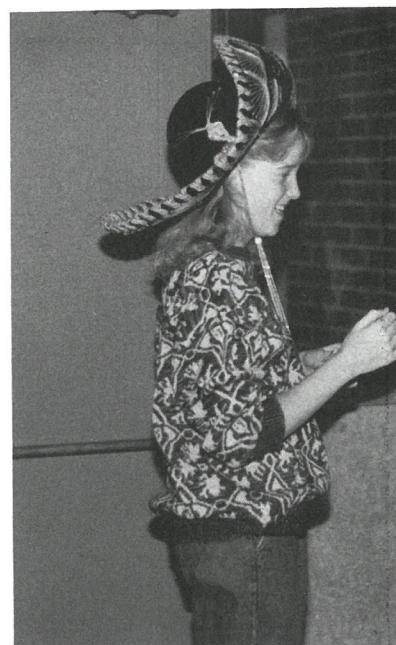
DRESSING UP!



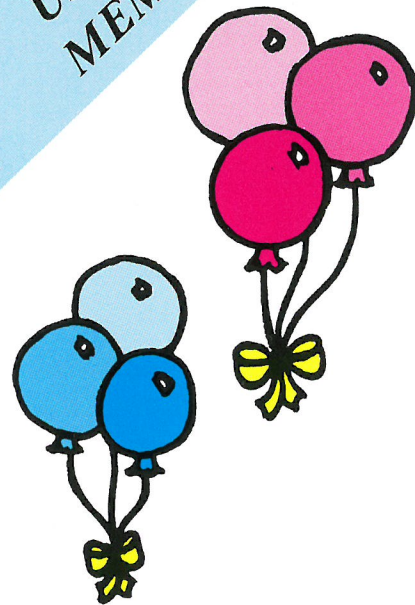

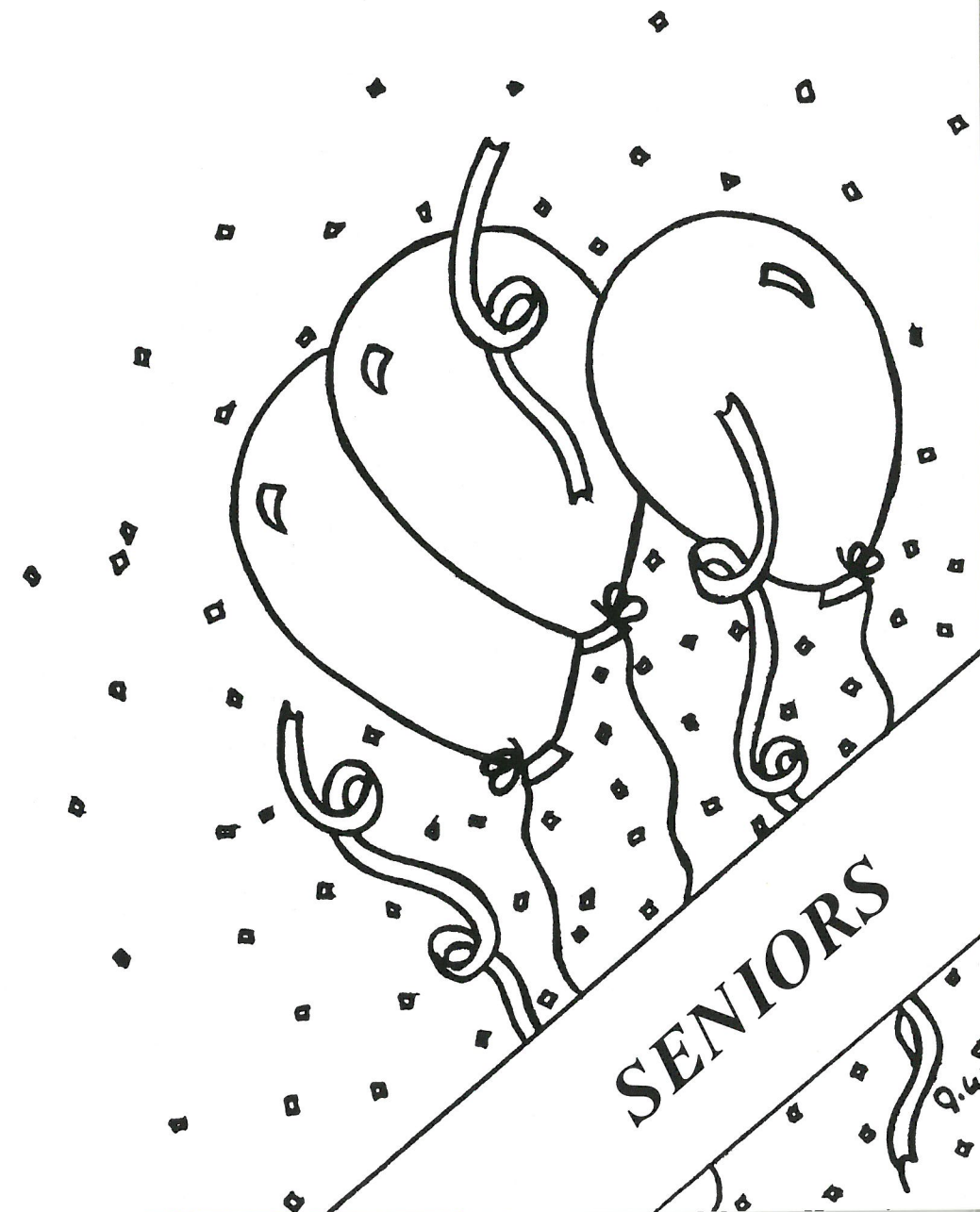
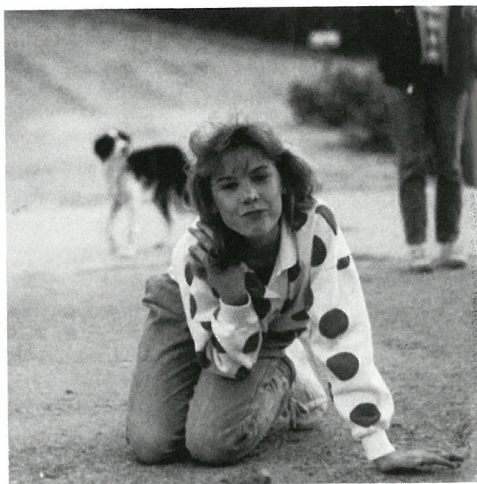


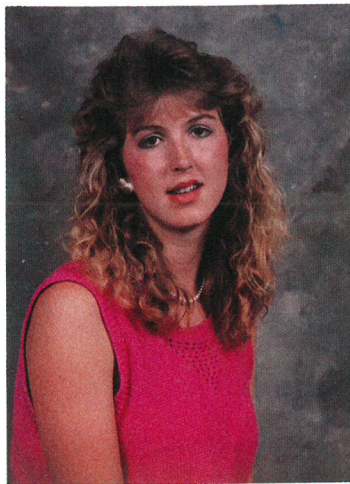
"I Love Christmas" was the theme of the 1987 Christmas Program. Chadwick students under the direction of Lisa Boyd sang a variety of Christmas carols.

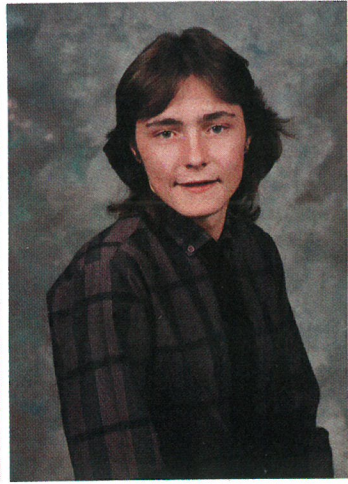
The spring carnival was filled with visiting, games, and excitement.

The evening ended by Rev. Carnell Johnson giving the Benediction and Ms. Lisa Boyd playing the Recessional.

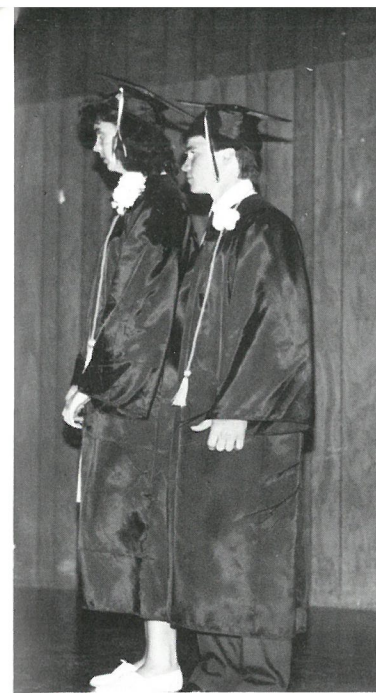
