Finally Vickie Stence, she wants to be herself, because everybody has their own special thing about them, you don't have to be somebody else to be special. (How true!)

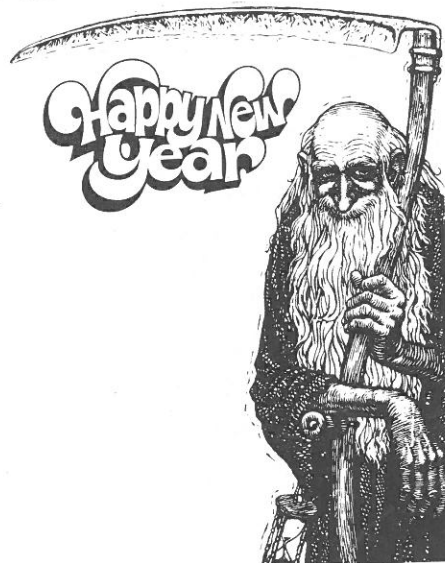
'87 Accomplishments

The class is open for all.



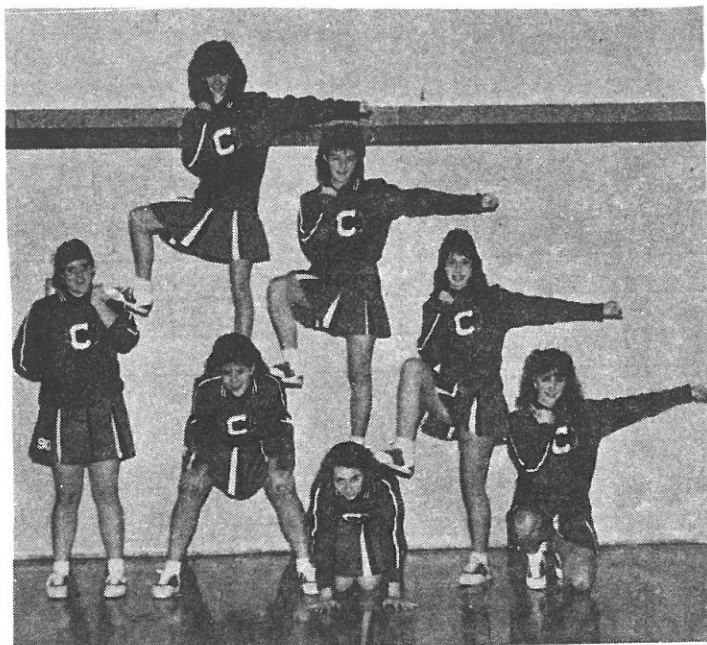

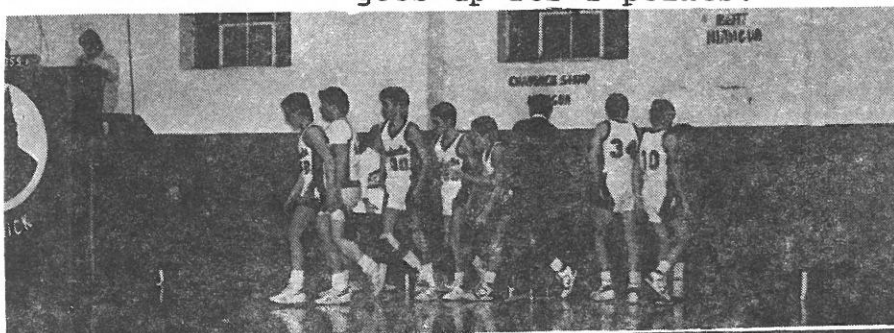

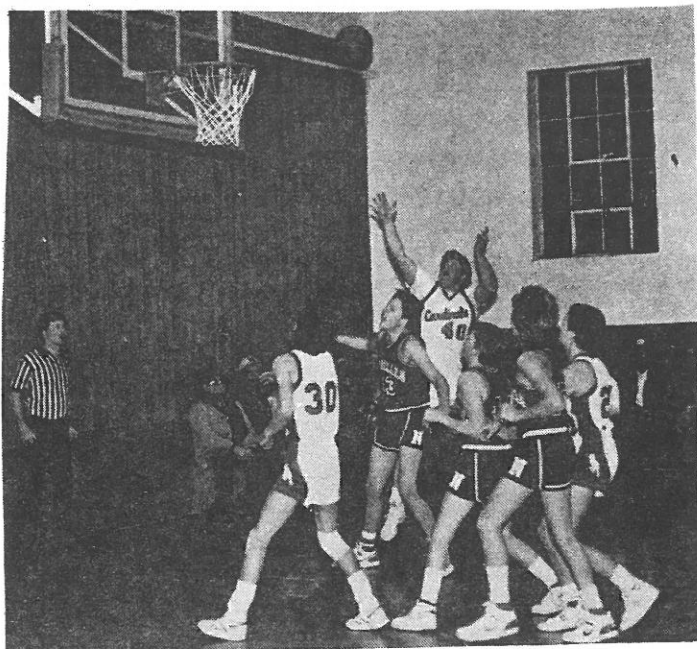

Every school has its share of interesting people, and Chadwick is no exception. We found a few of these, who then consented to an interview. They were located in none other than-- the fourth grade classroom.

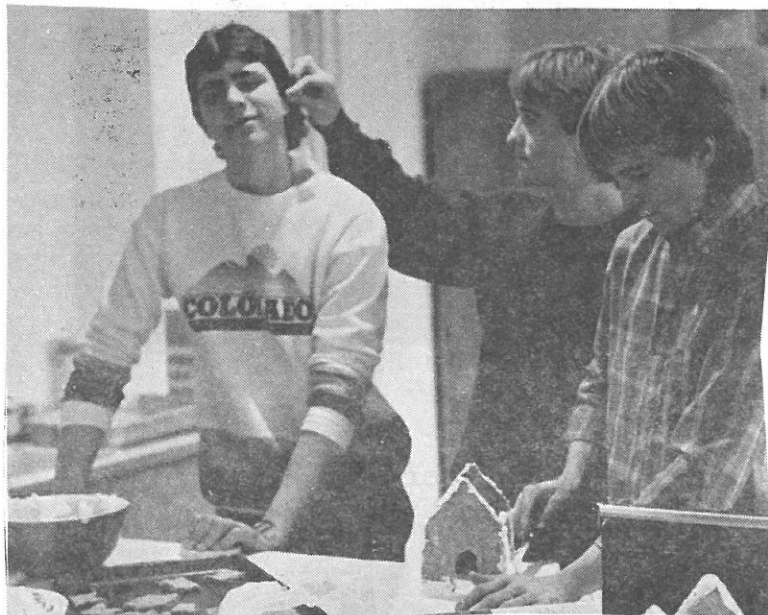
