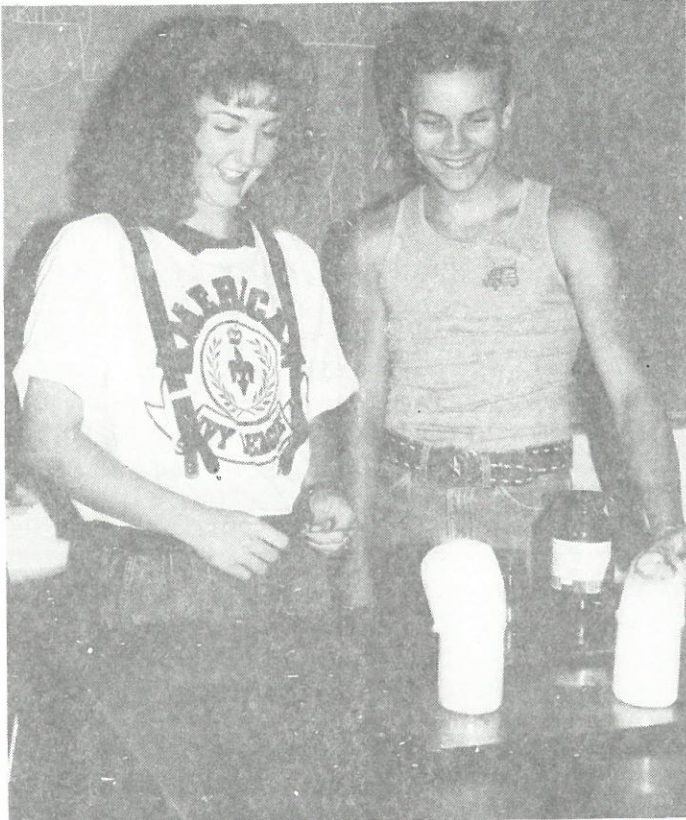
Big Plans For 1988 — 1989

Wavy lines shows a good response to music and dance, as do musical symbols, like notes and clefs.

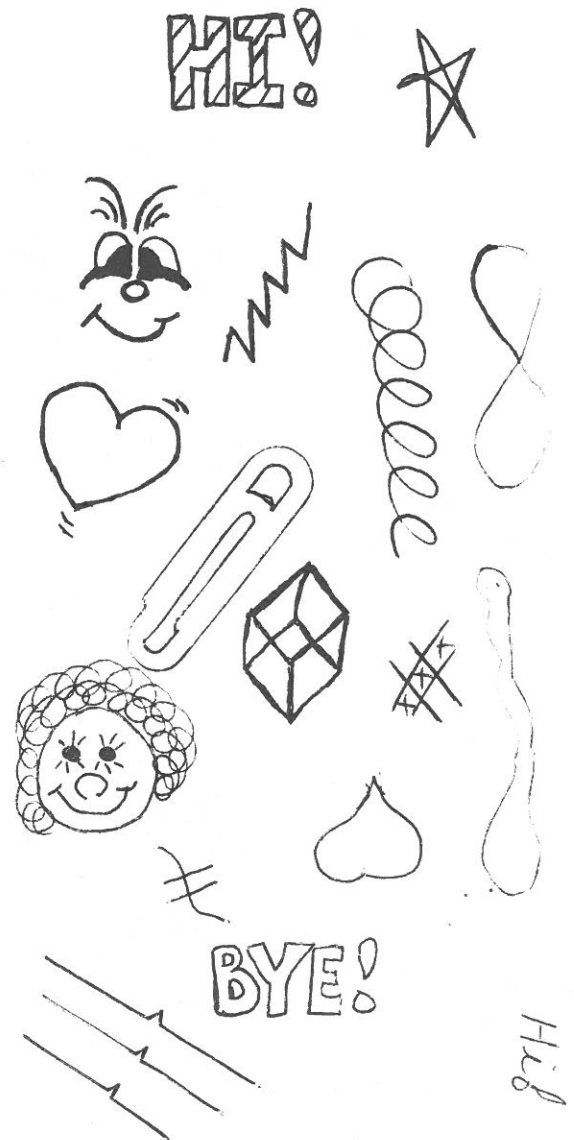
Circles are a sign of spiritual aspirations and optimism based on faith.

Little hearts signal a personality that's most likely sentimental, affectionate, loving, and romantic.

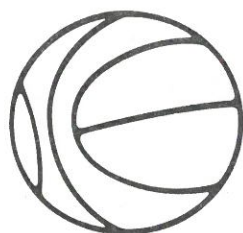
