Sure there was lots of work to do, but being with friends made everything a lot more fun.


In August it seemed as if the year would never end — but were we wrong. The year just flew by.



# EXCUSES!



Teachers often hear so many excuses they can't tell the truth from a line to get out of trouble.


Mrs. Horton said that a boy in one of her classes told her that his dog ate his book so he couldn't do the work, a week later he told her that his dog died.

Junior candidate Amy Grove was crowned 1989 Homecoming Queen February 24.


"When I'm with you" by Sheriff was the theme song. The stage was decorated in black and white with black and white balloons.






CHAMPS OF CHEER!

# AMANDA MAHR

Fifty Years In **Education** 



Mrs. Amanda Mahr began her teaching career at Pelham near Protem, Mo. in 1938. Mrs. Mahr retired at the end of this school year.

Mrs. Mahr taught at Pelham for two years, Hilltop for five years, Cedar Grove for four years, Bald Knob for two years before going to Forsyth for eleven years, all in Taney county. She came to Chadwick in the fall of 1963 and has taught here for the past twenty-six years. Mrs. Mahr has been an outstanding educator in Taney and Christian counties for the past fifty years.

Mrs. Mahr began teaching on a county certificate. She received a B.S. in Education from SMSU in 1956, did correspondence work from the University of Arkansas and later attended Drury College.

Mrs. Mahr was selected "Teacher of the Year" by M.S.T.A. in 1985-86 and was presented an award at the annual fall conference. During her twenty-six years at Chadwick she has taught in grades five, six, seven, and eight. She developed the curriculum for the Special Education Program and was the first instructor. She was the administrator of the Summer School for eight years. She was the first elementary principal and held the position for a number of years. The 1984-85 yearbook was dedicated in her honor. She has served on many committees, attended and participated in many workshops. Mrs. Mahr has been a P.T.A. member in the schools where she taught and has been a member of the Missouri State Teacher Association for 50 years.

Mrs. Mahr will be missed very much at Chadwick. We all wish her the best of everything.
