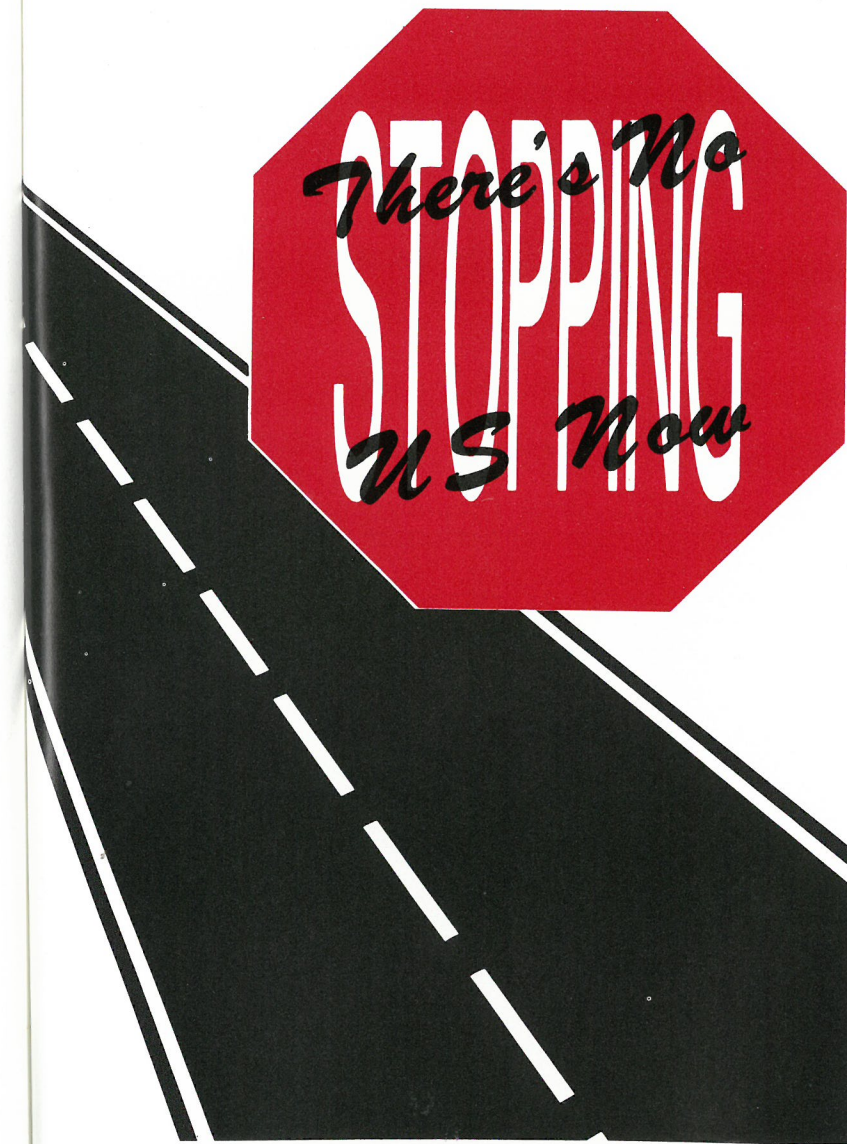

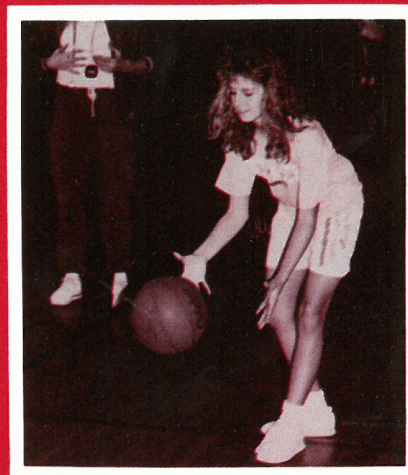
Mondays ... Classes ... Tardy Bells ... Teachers ... Pop Quizzes ... Homework ... Studying ... that endless cycle.

In August it seemed as if the year would never end — but were we wrong. The year just flew by.

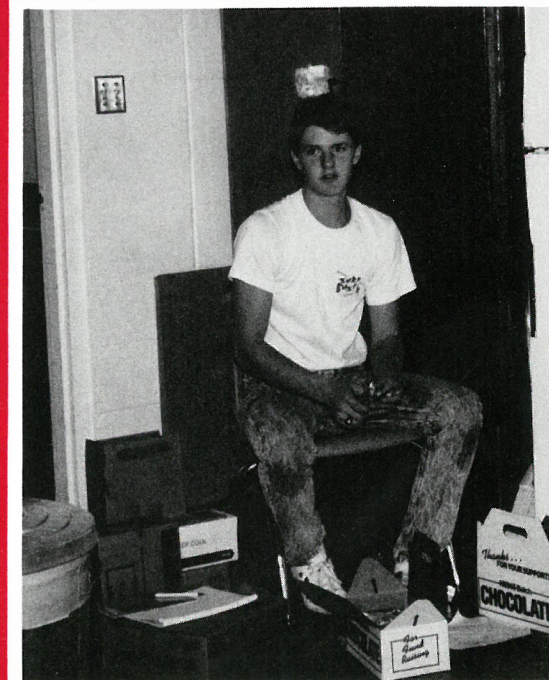
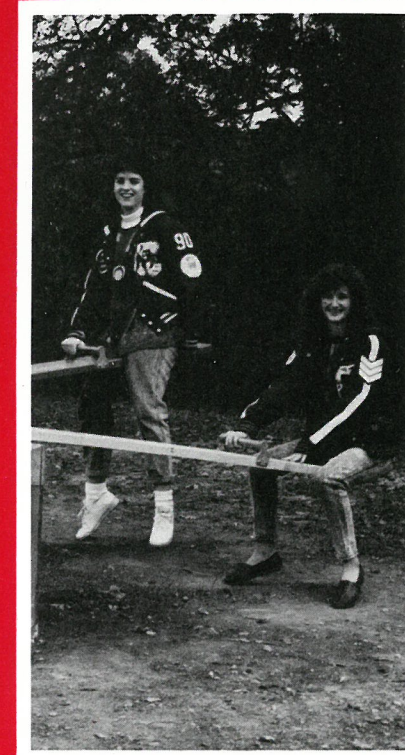
The yearbook staff tried to put many memories of the 1988-89 school year into this book. We hope that the following pages will bring back some of those great times.

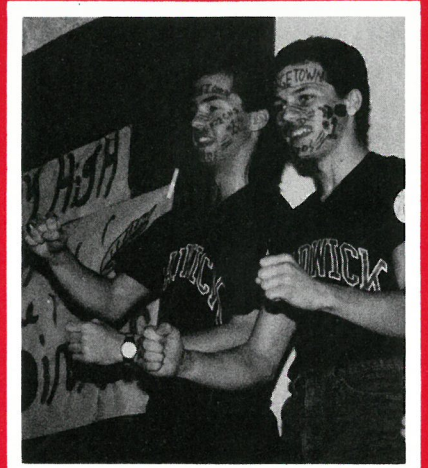

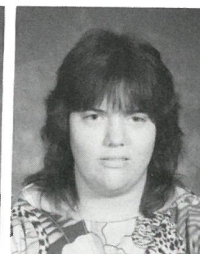
Changing Lanes! Changing classes, new teachers, junior high sports, bake sales, and faculty pen pals were only a few activities that made this year great!

Junior candidate Amy Grove was crowned 1989 Homecoming Queen February 24.

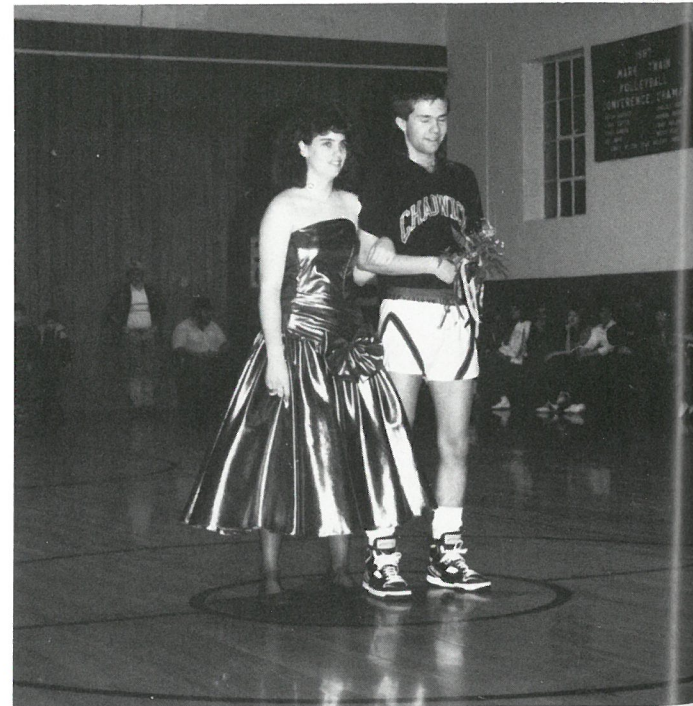
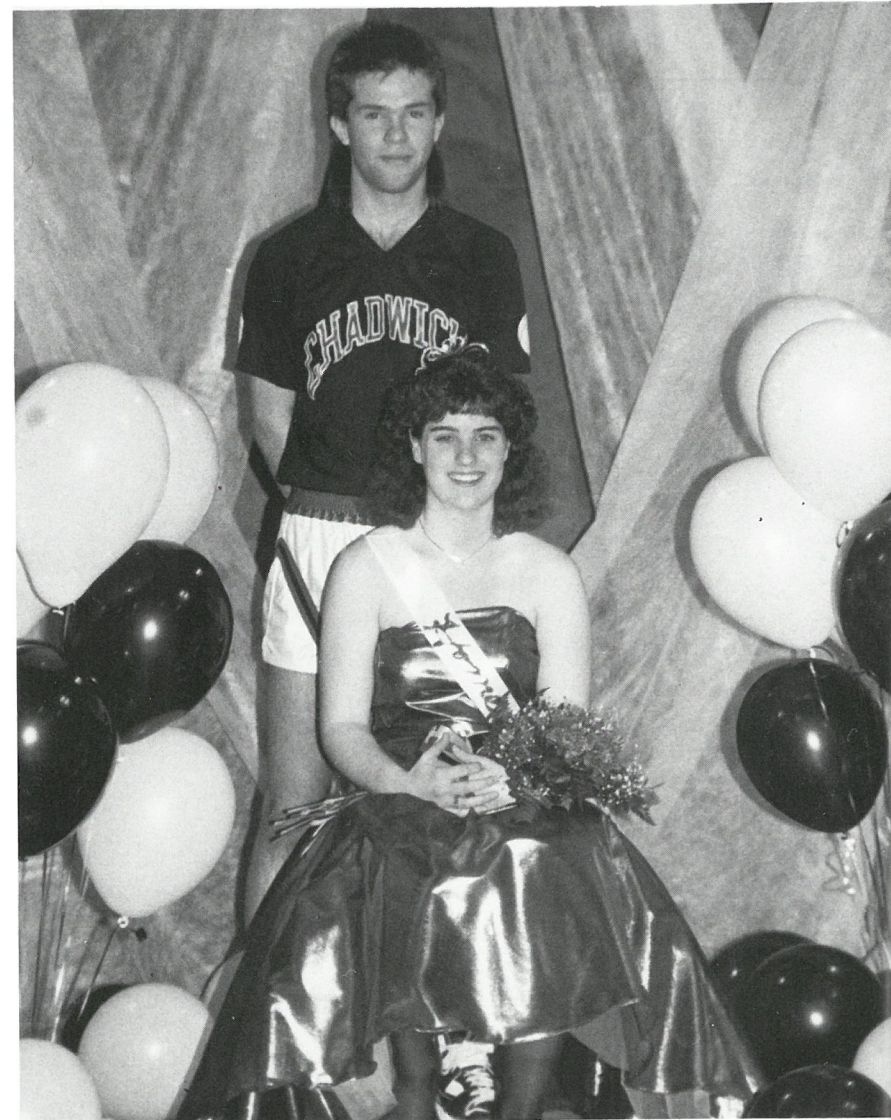
"When I'm with you" by Sheriff was the theme song. The stage was decorated in black and white with black and white balloons.

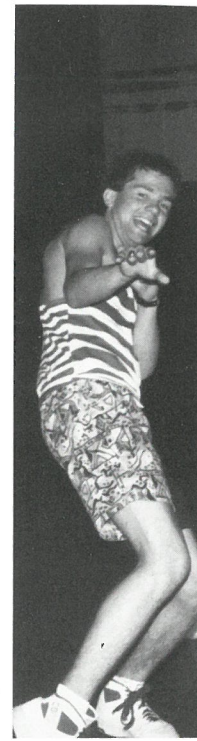
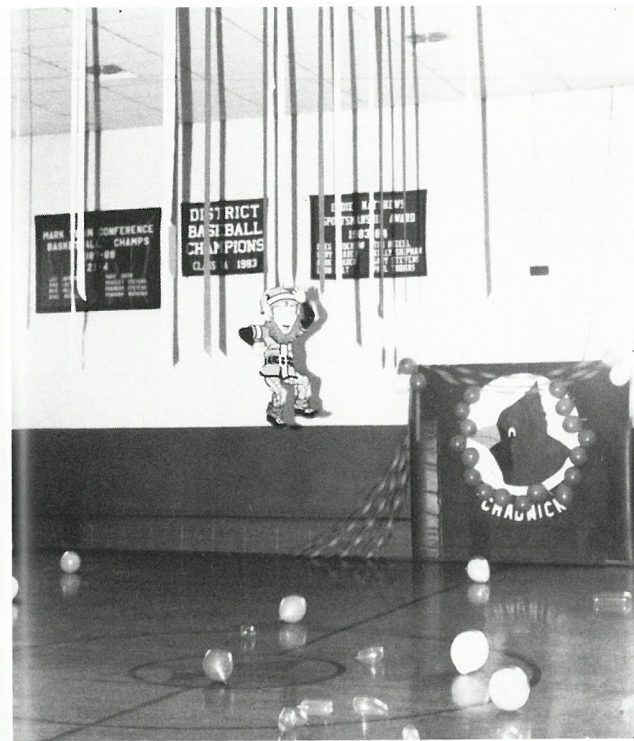
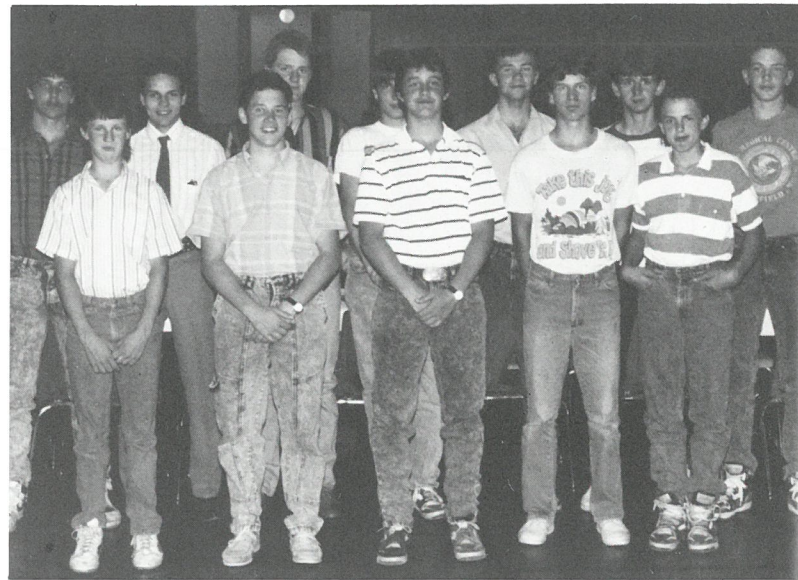
The PTA hosted the annual Athletic Banquet Friday, April 21. After the meal, the coaches and cheerleading sponsors gave out awards.

The Lady Cardinals were one of the best serving teams in the conference, serving 85%.

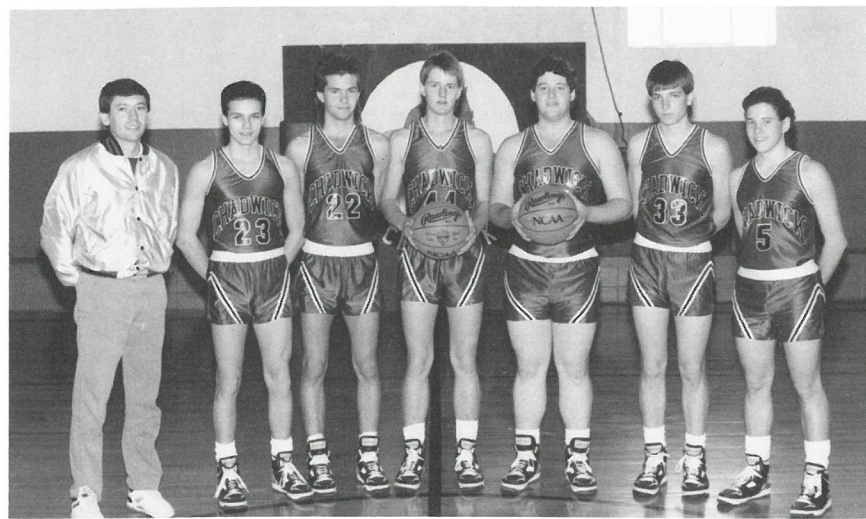

AMANDA MAHR

Fifty Years In Education



Mrs. Amanda Mahr began her teaching career at Pelham near Protom, Mo. in 1938. Mrs. Mahr retired at the end of this school year.

Mrs. Mahr taught at Pelham for two years, Hilltop for five years, Cedar Grove for four years, Bald Knob for two years before going to Forsyth for eleven years, all in Taney county. She came to Chadwick in the fall of 1963 and has taught here for the past twenty-six years. Mrs. Mahr has been an outstanding educator in Taney and Christian counties for the past fifty years.

Mrs. Mahr began teaching on a county certificate. She received a B.S. in Education from SMSU in 1956, did correspondence work from the University of Arkansas and later attended Drury College.

Mrs. Mahr was selected "Teacher of the Year" by M.S.T.A. in 1985-86 and was presented an award at the annual fall conference. During her twenty-six years at Chadwick she has taught in grades five, six, seven, and eight. She developed the curriculum for the Special Education Program and was the first instructor.
