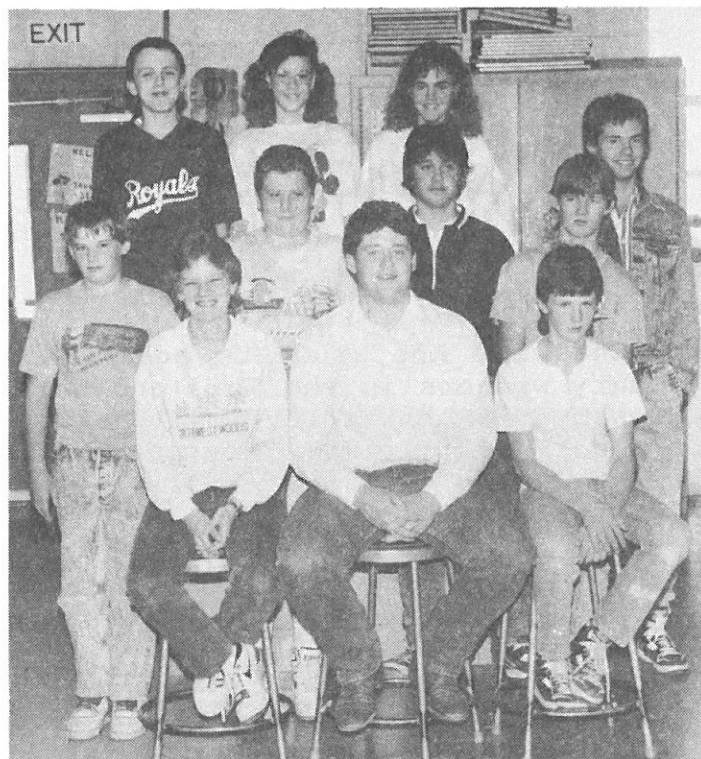
Chadwick Hosts Industrial Arts Fair

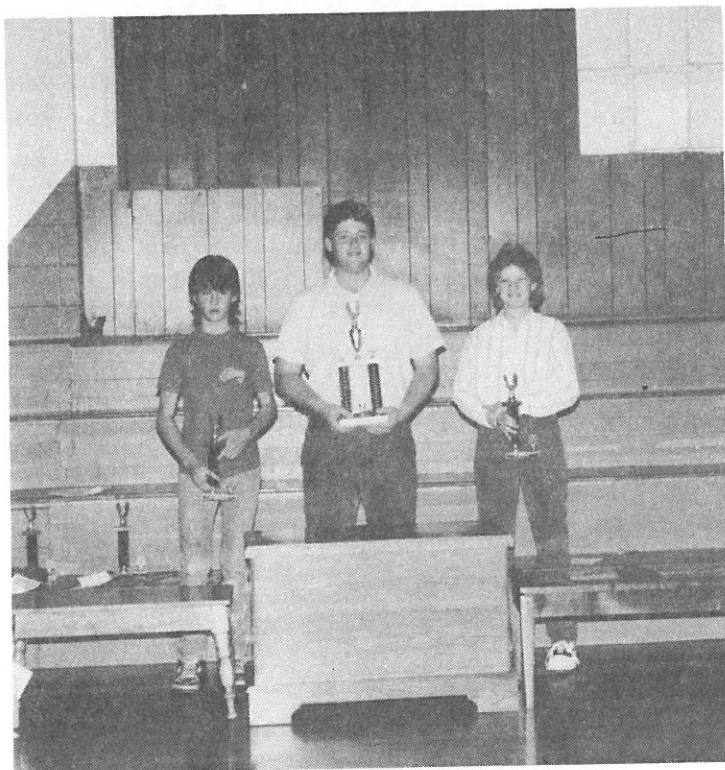

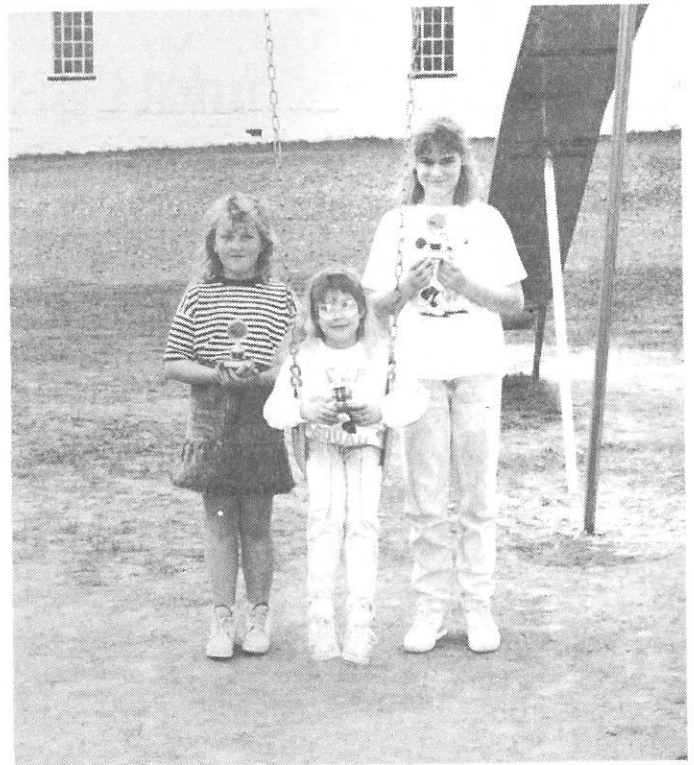
