### Halloween Plans



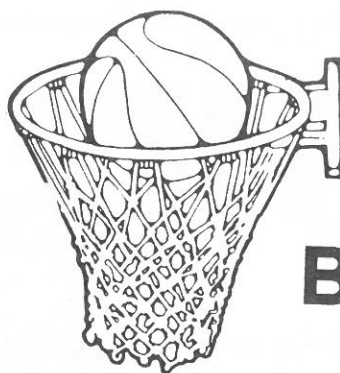

## Jr. High Basketball

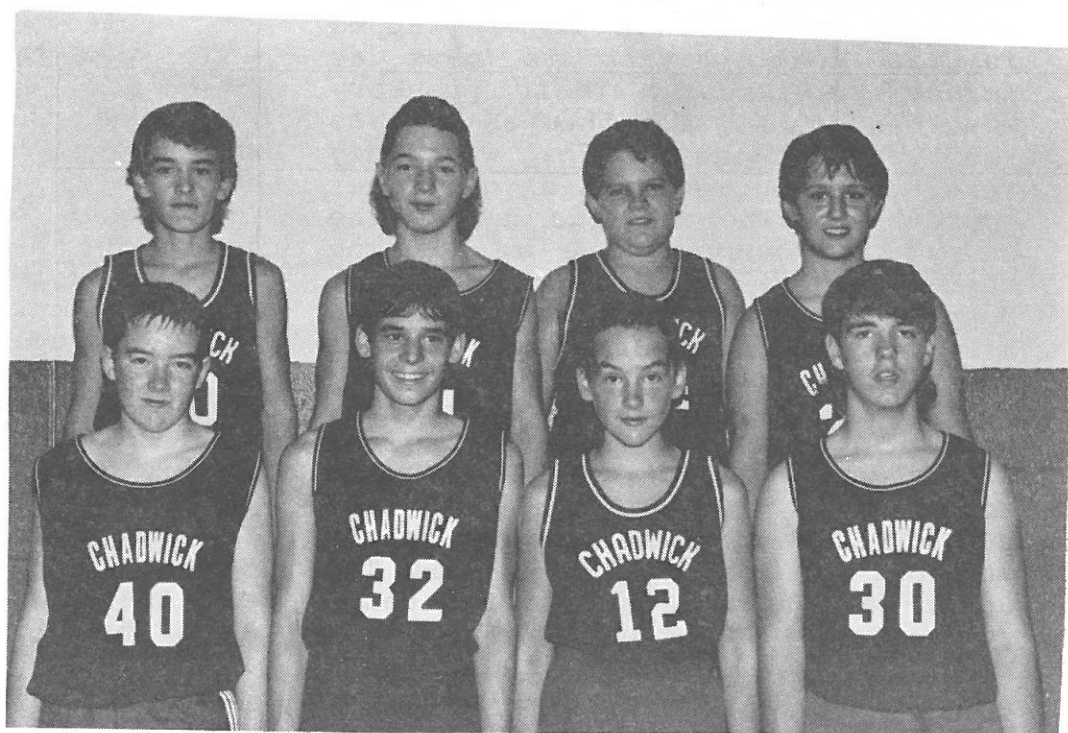

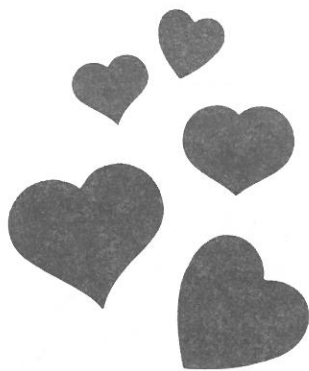

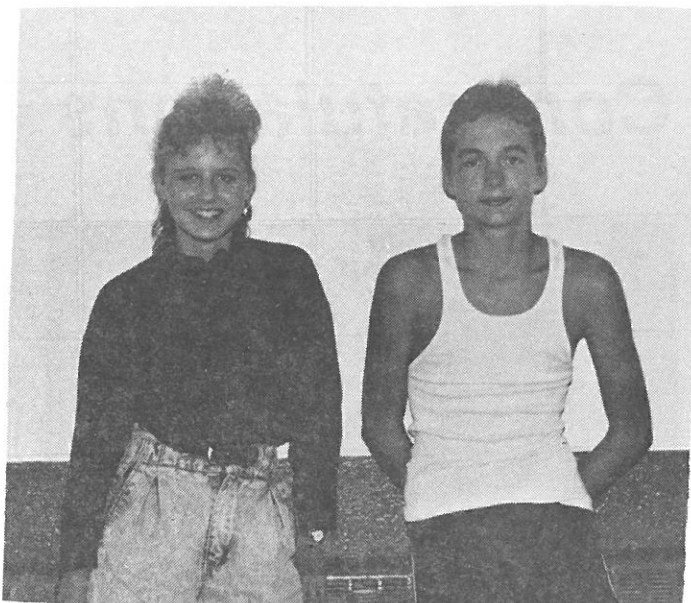

As the school librarian she welcomes all students to the library. She also welcomes requests for books and magazines that may not be in the library.



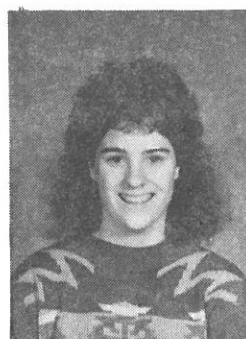

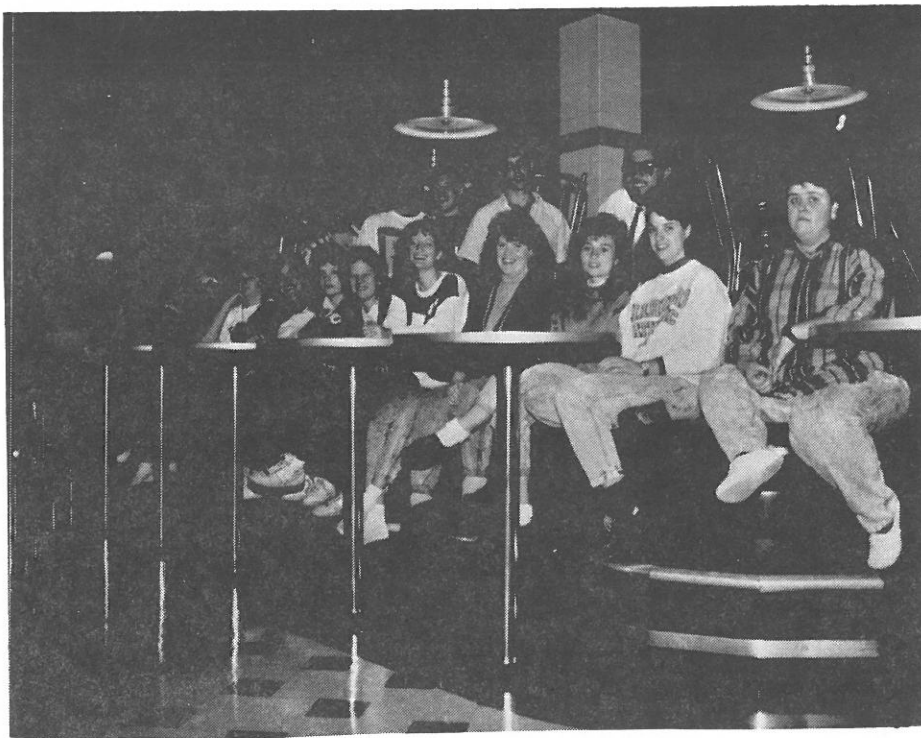


## SMSU Honors Mrs. Mahr
