


Melissa Loomis, Misty Fintel, and Mrs. Treva Henderson dress up for Hippie Day during Spirit Week.



Tina Weter dresses up for slob day during Spirit Week.






## Teachers Recognition


The 1989-90 Girls Basketball season began with a home game against Fordland.

Calendars are finished and on sale now. The Graphic/Printmaking class has worked hard and have made our best calendar yet. See them in the Art room.




