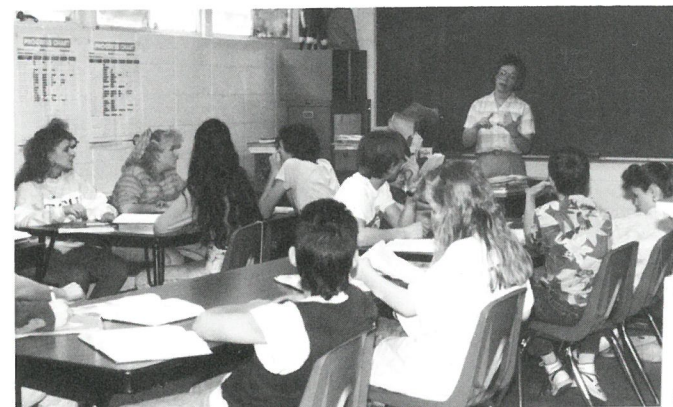
LIBRARY

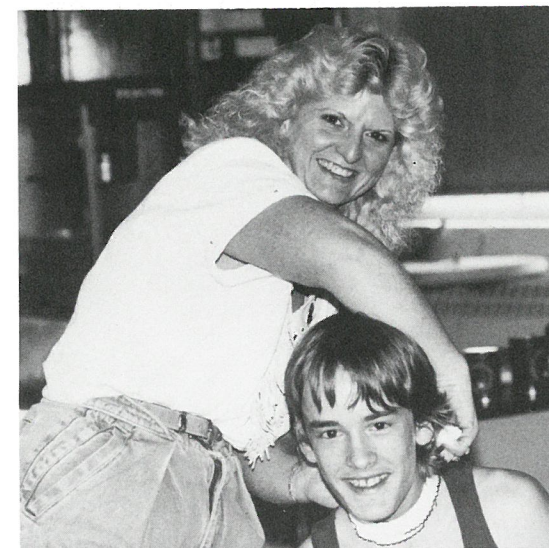
HISTORY

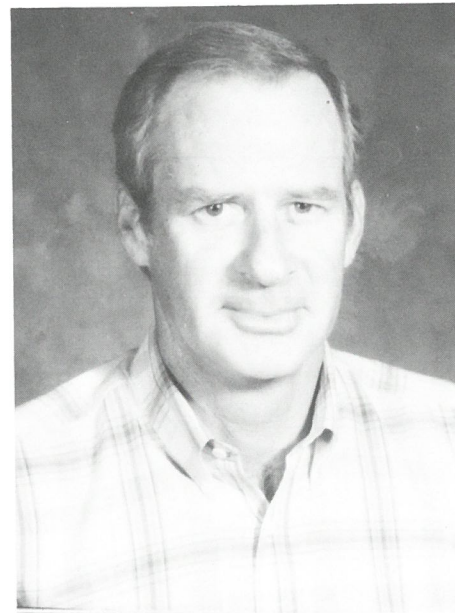


HOME ECONOMICS

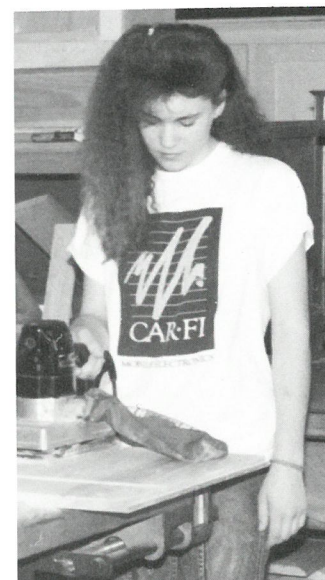
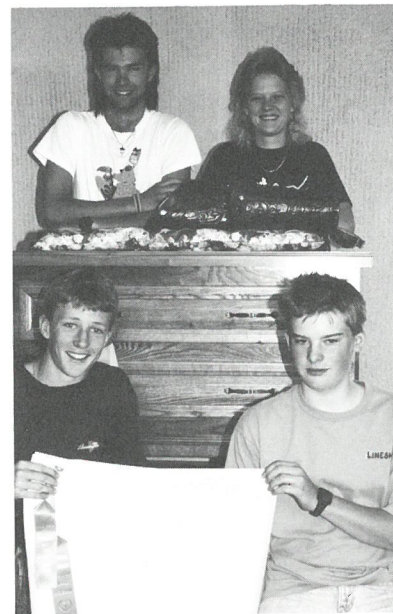

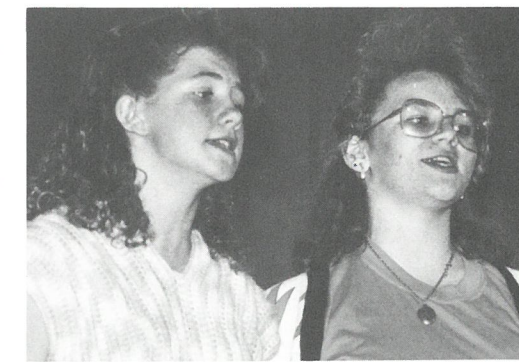
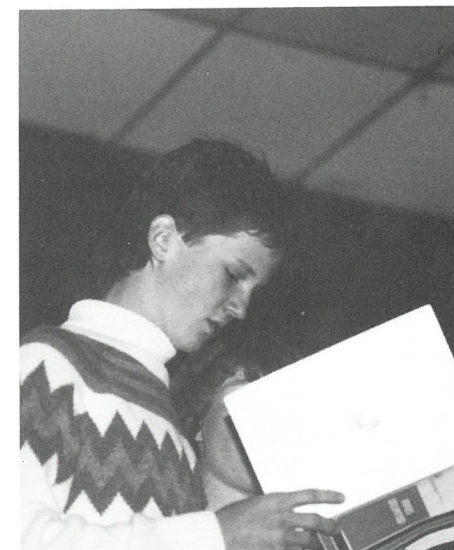
BOYS P.E.

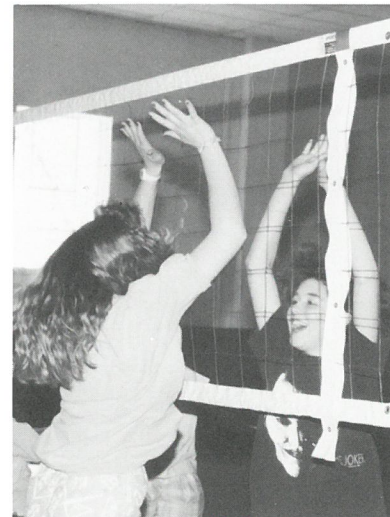
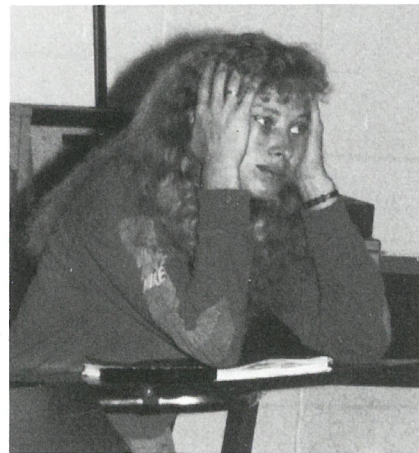
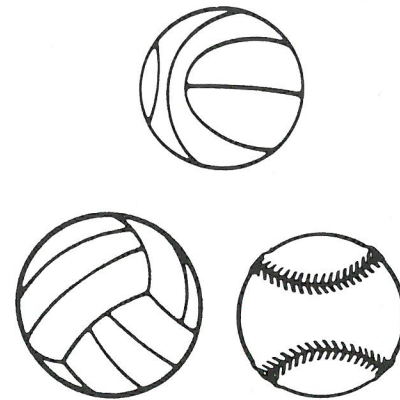
MUSIC

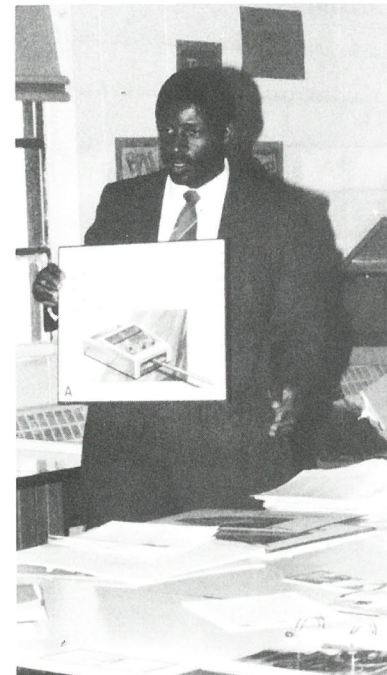
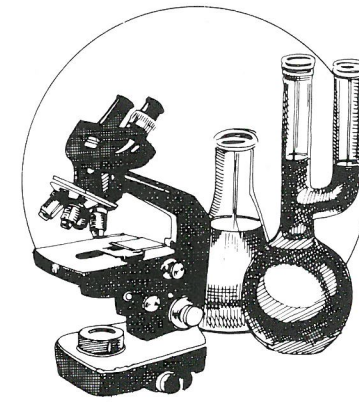
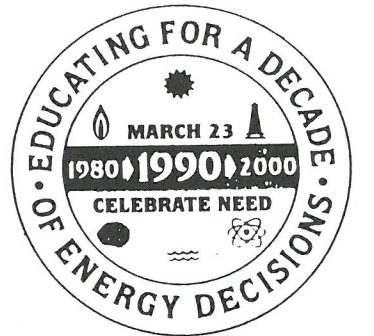


GIRL'S P.E.

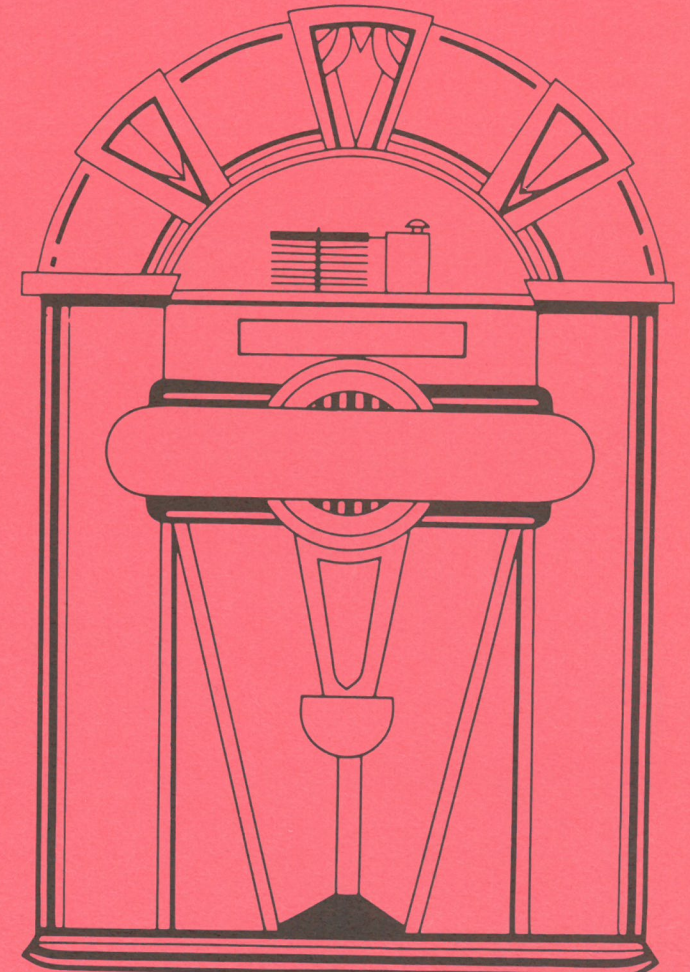
