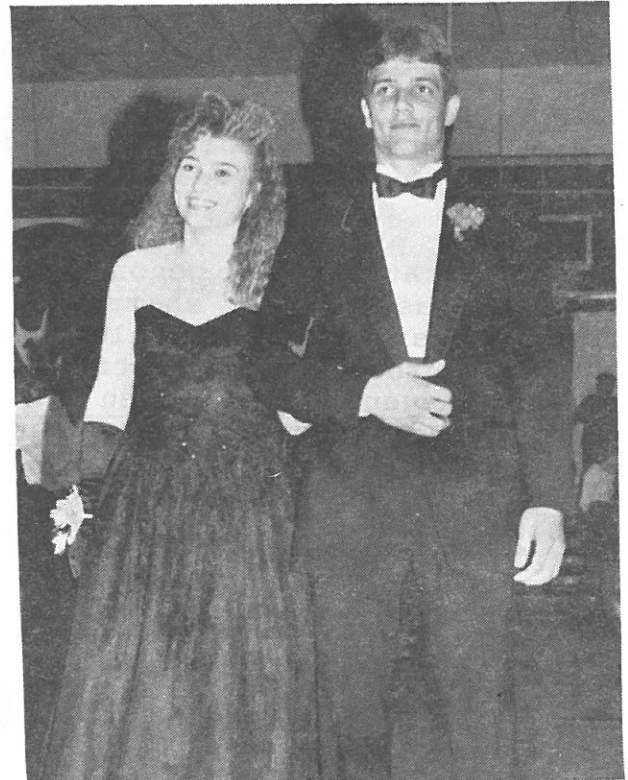
CARNIVAL 1990

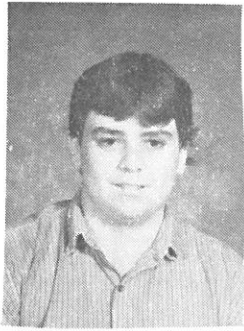

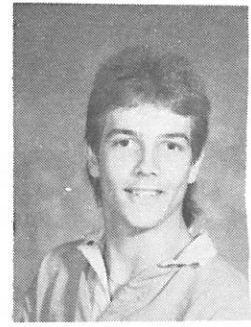

Teacher Recognition

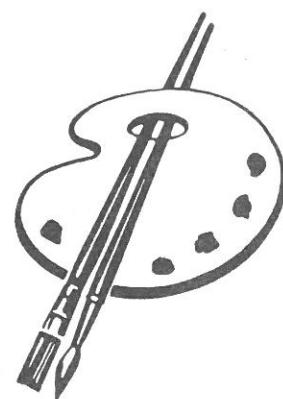

CHADWICK WINS AT ART SHOW

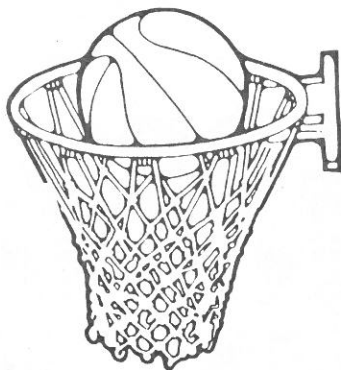

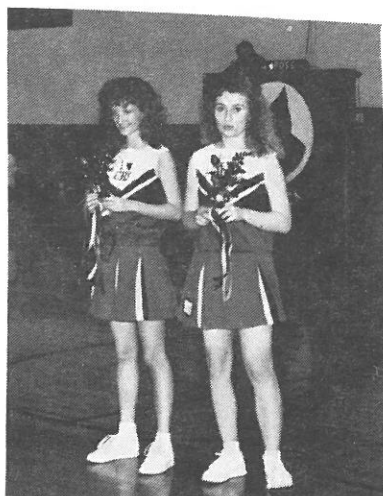

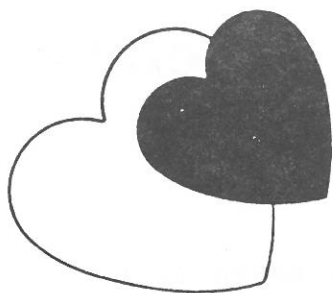

VALENTINE'S DAY

There are many different ways to celebrate Valentines Day.

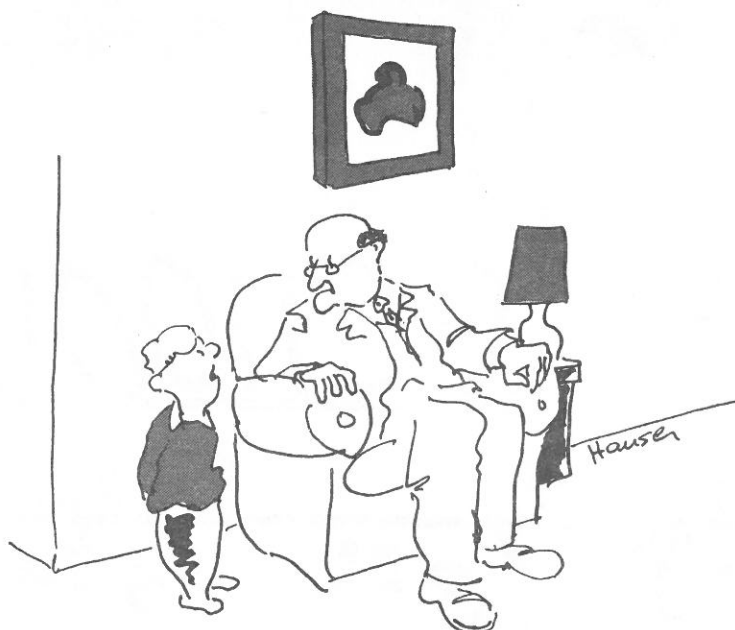

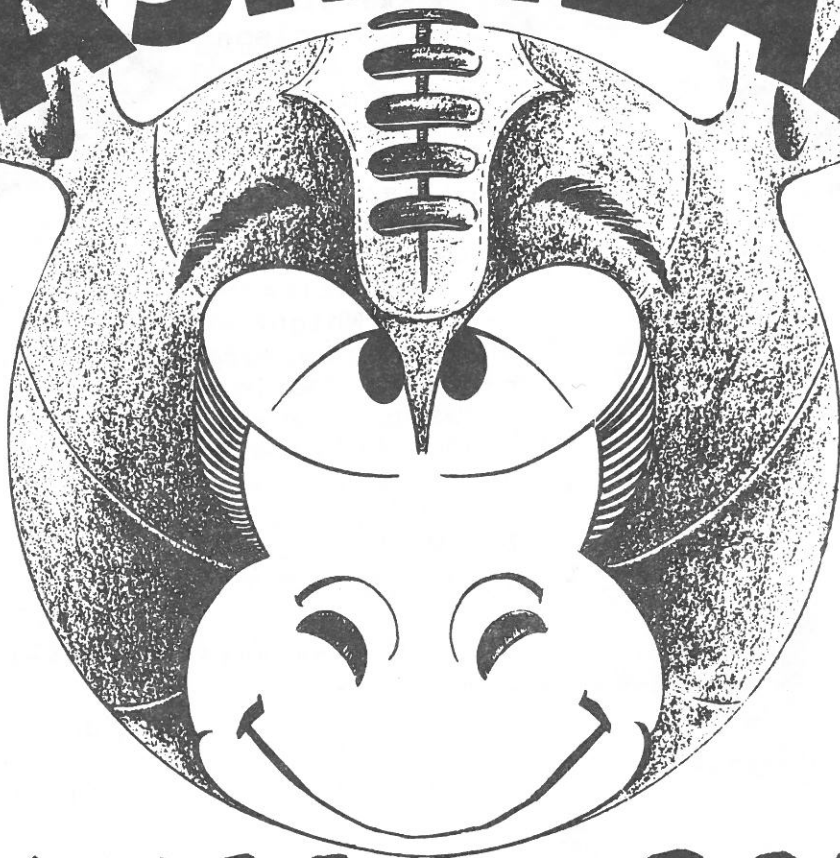
