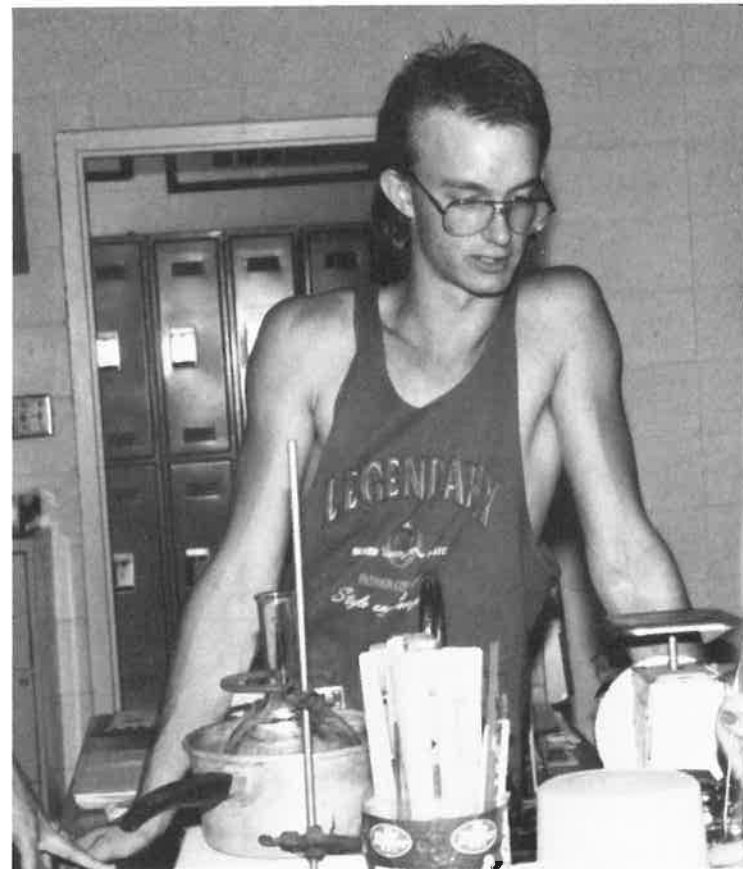

Lunch TIME

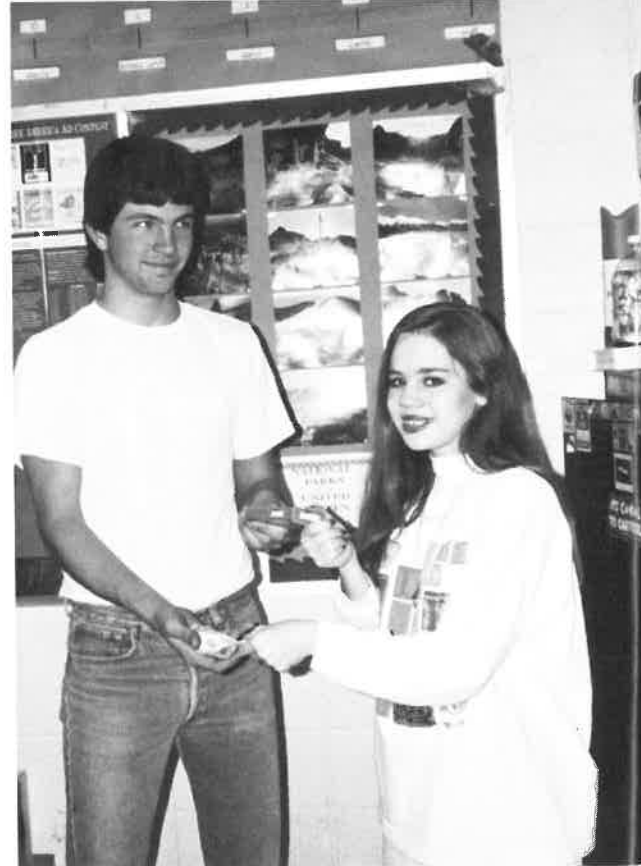
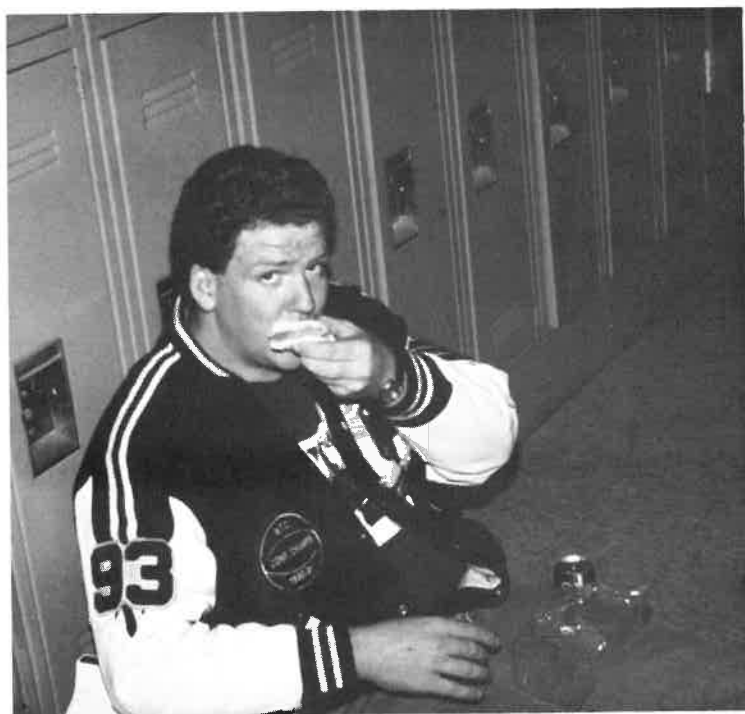
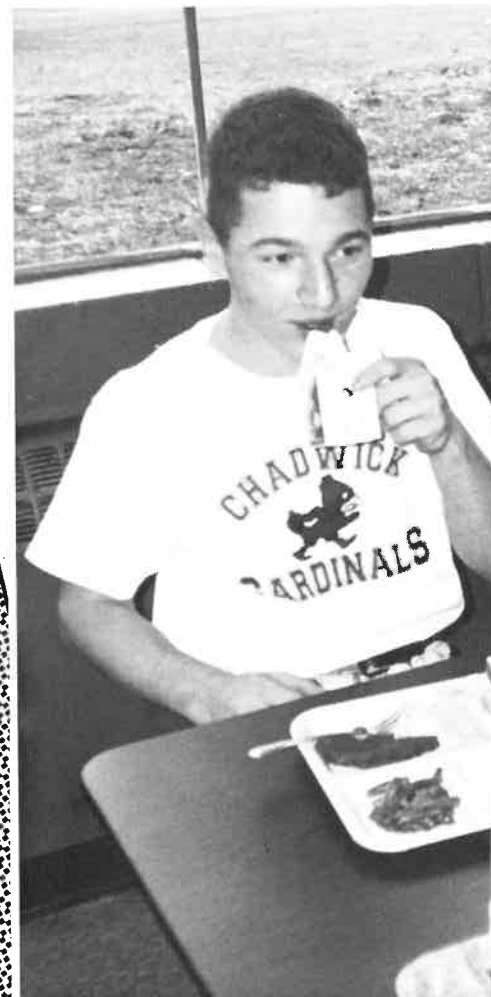

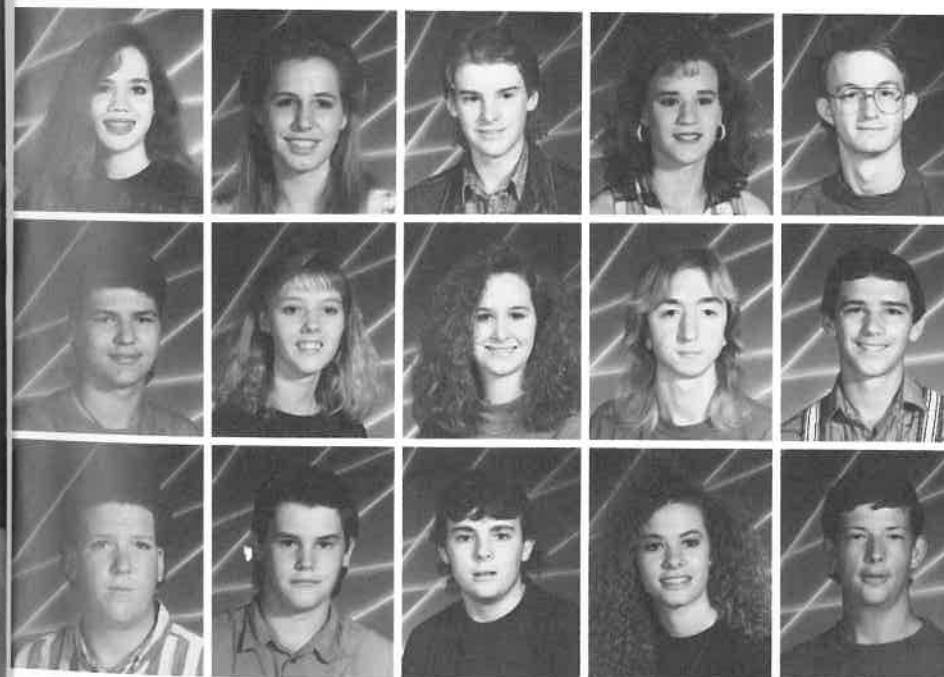

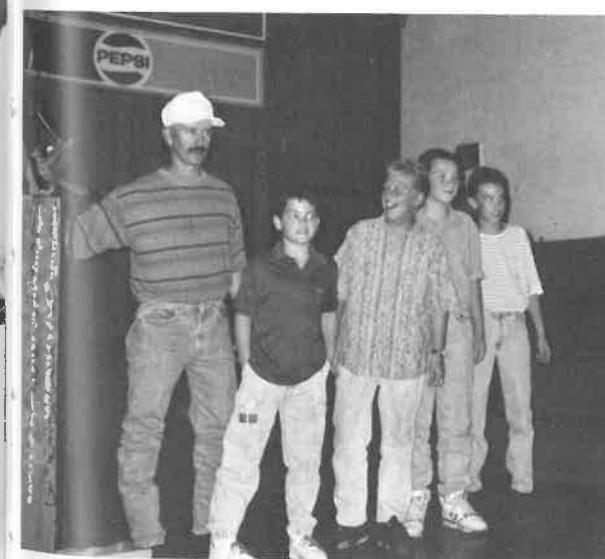

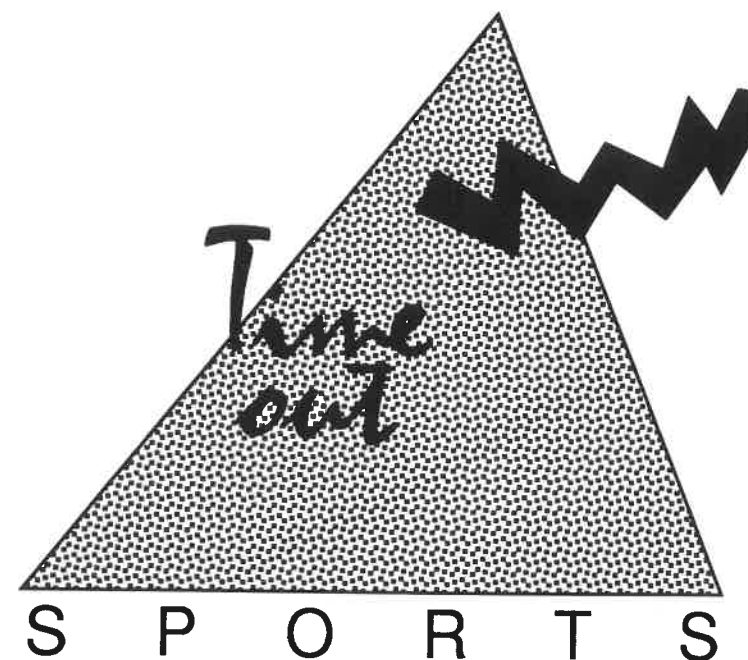

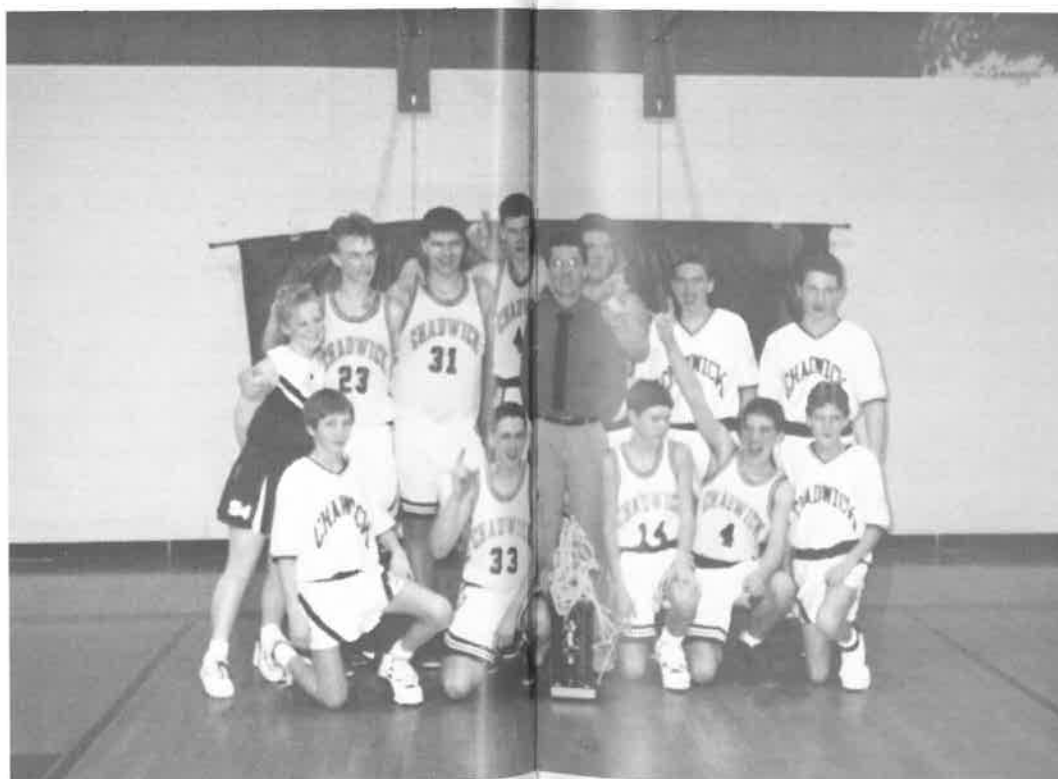
CHS Shows Sportsmanship

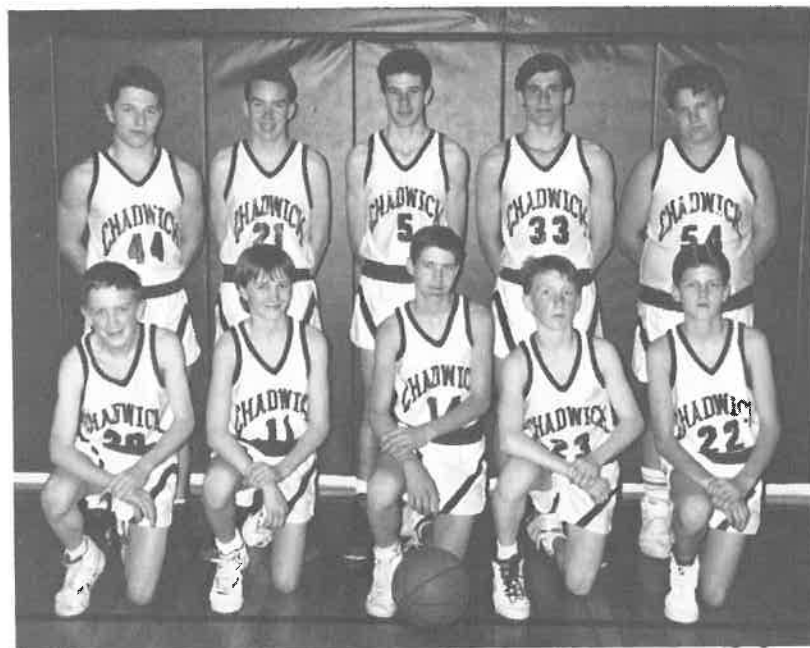

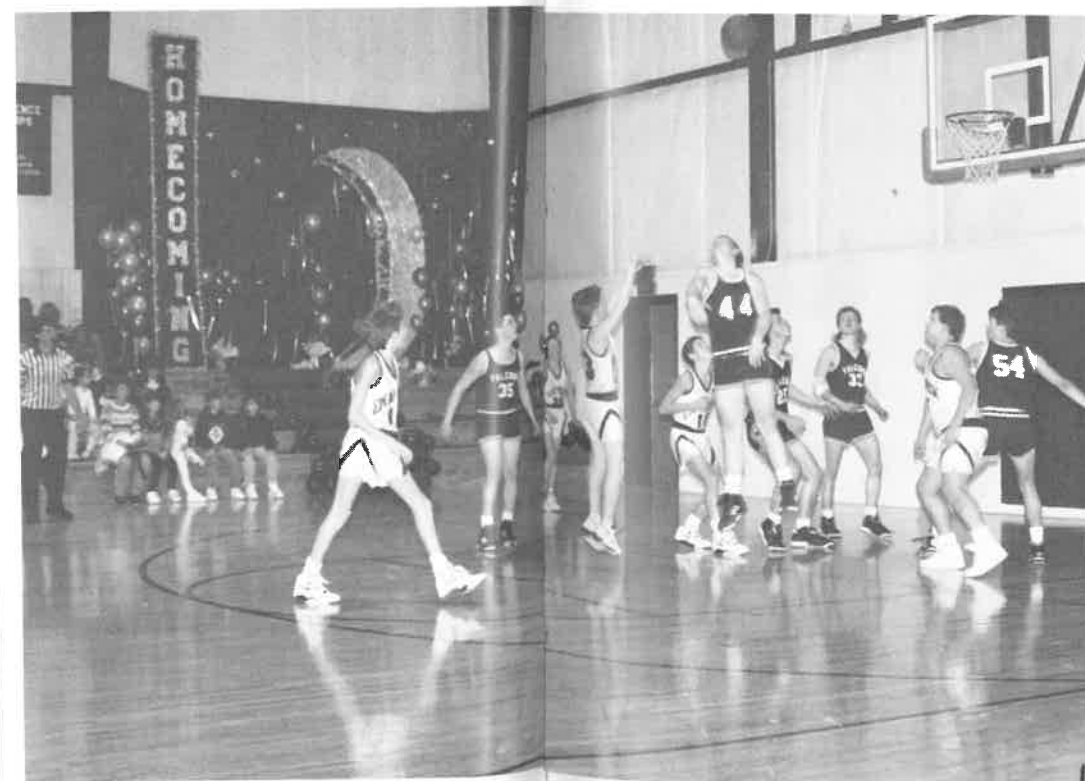

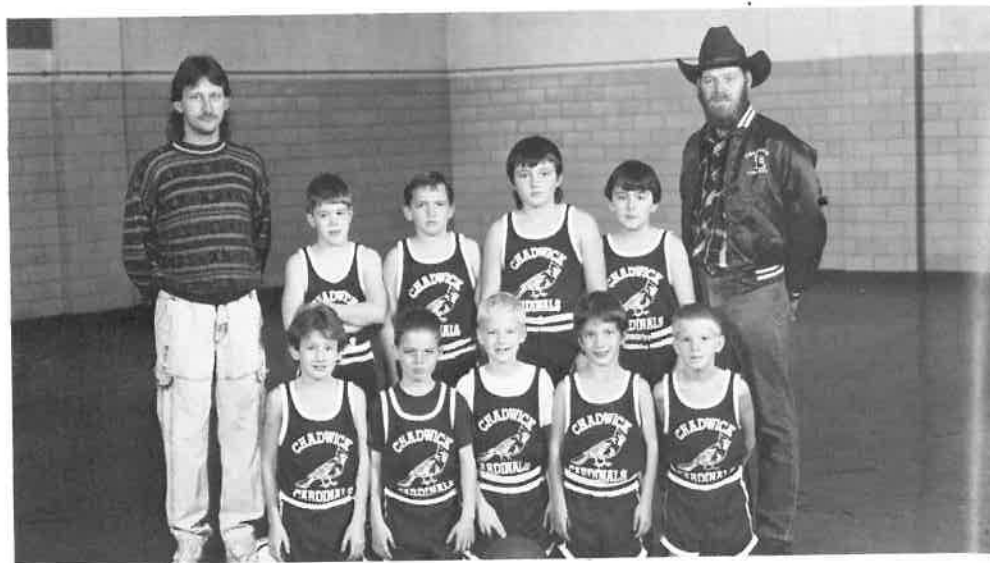
