We hope throughout the following pages to give a realistic view of our school, not only the products of our effort, but the friendship and the work that has gone into making our school what it is today.





ties that also show students work.







The last event of the year was the Sr. Breakfast. A variety of fruit and pastries were served to faculty, staff, members, and seniors.







Seniors Stefanie Weter, Julie Coffer, Lisa Phillips and Tina Nalley all agree that this year was one of the best for friendships among team members and Coach Long. With this being their last year, they expressed how happy they were to have had the memories and experiences of playing volleyball in their high school years. They also said that they will miss playing volleyball and that they will always remember the good times they shared as part of the Chadwick High School Volleyball team.








