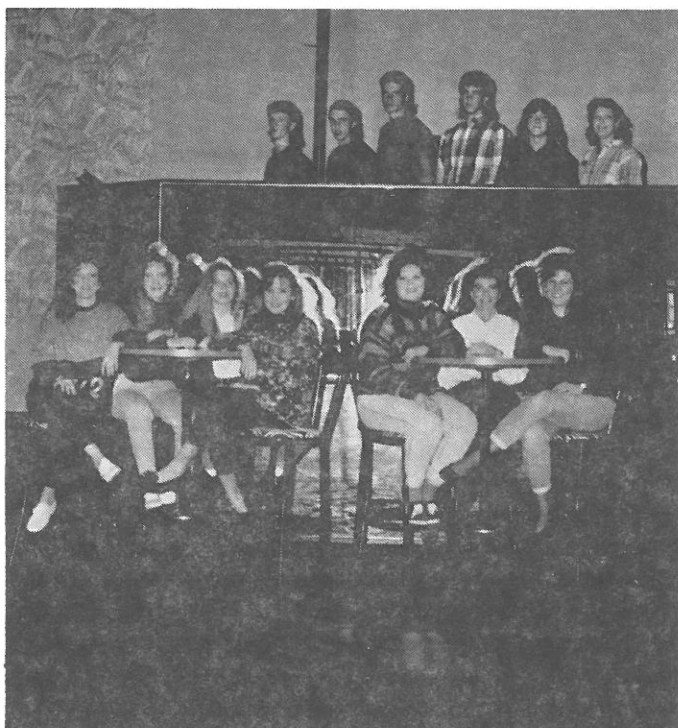

Chadwick's Seniors Earn Scholarships And Awards

Several seniors from Chadwick's 1992 graduating class have been offered awards and scholarships.

Tina Nalley, Valedictorian of her senior class, has been offered the Dean's Scholarship, Academic Honors Scholarship, and Leadership Award from Drury College; the President's Scholarship from Missouri Southern; the Freshman Regents Scholarship from SMSU, and the Tylenol/Walmart Scholarship. 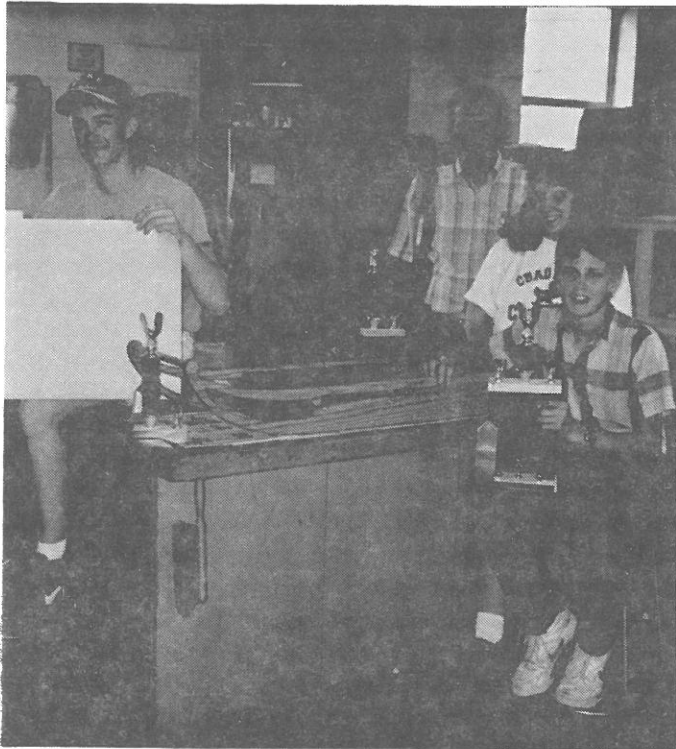

Chadwick Successful In Industrial Arts Competition



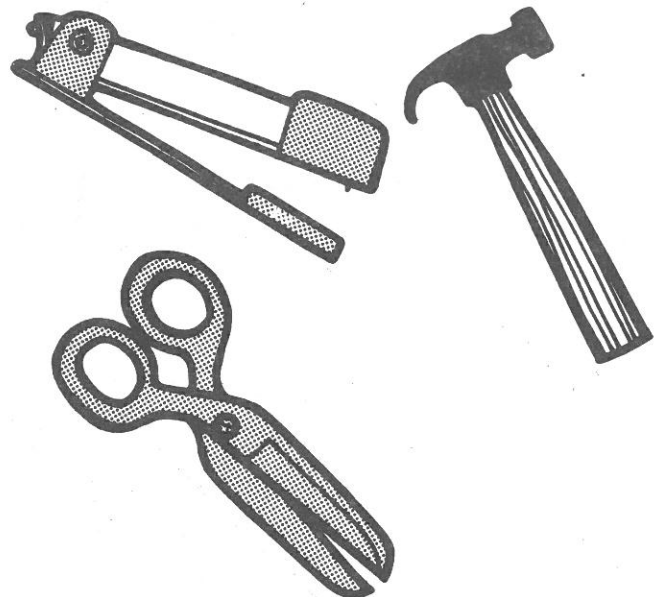

Winners at the Southwest Missouri District Program was Jack Guerin with his sled, Ben Whight with his table, and Christal Gilbert with her gun rack.

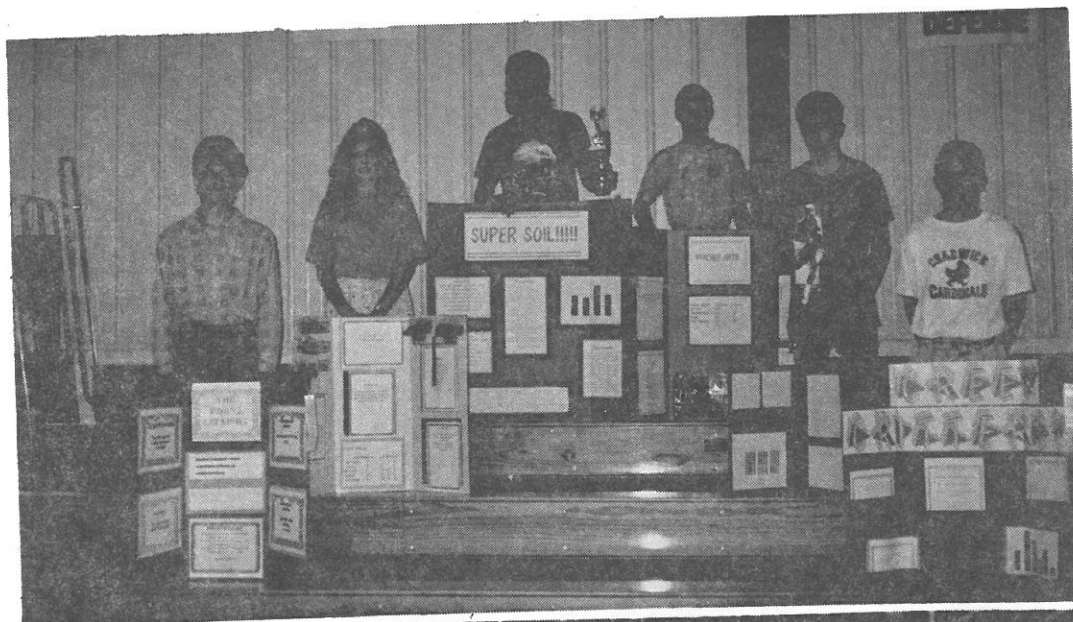

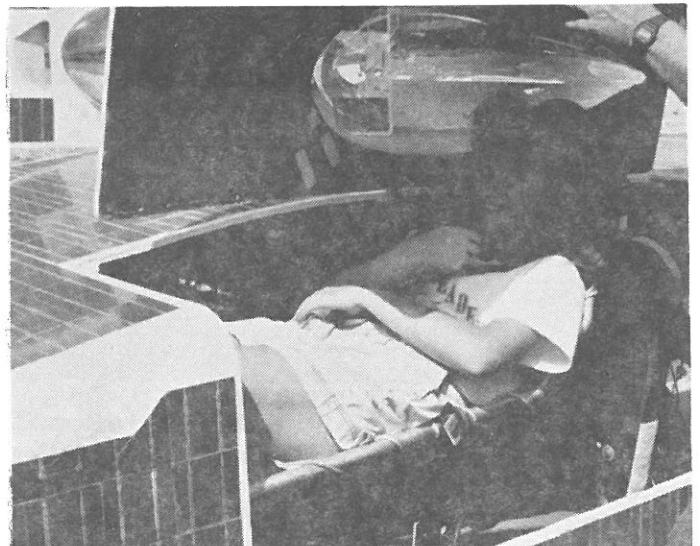


Need Workshop

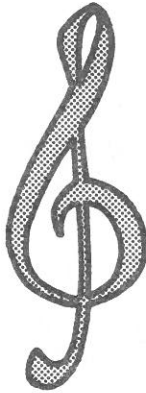

M.I.P.S. Jr. High Teen Institute Camp

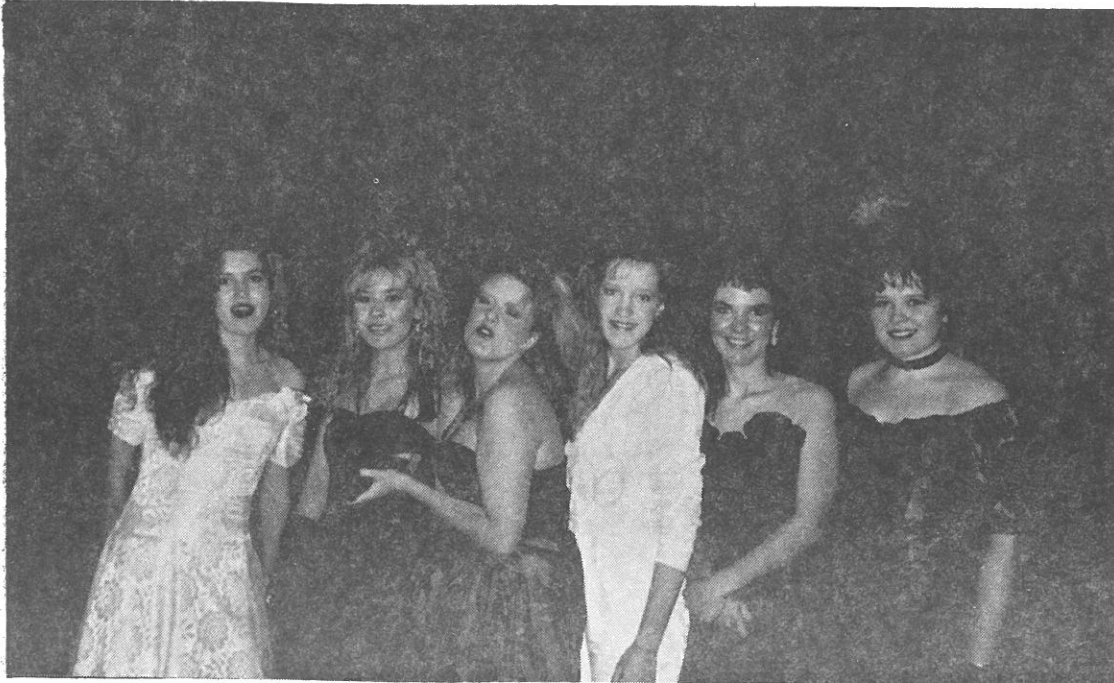
