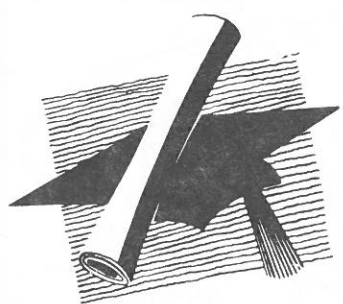

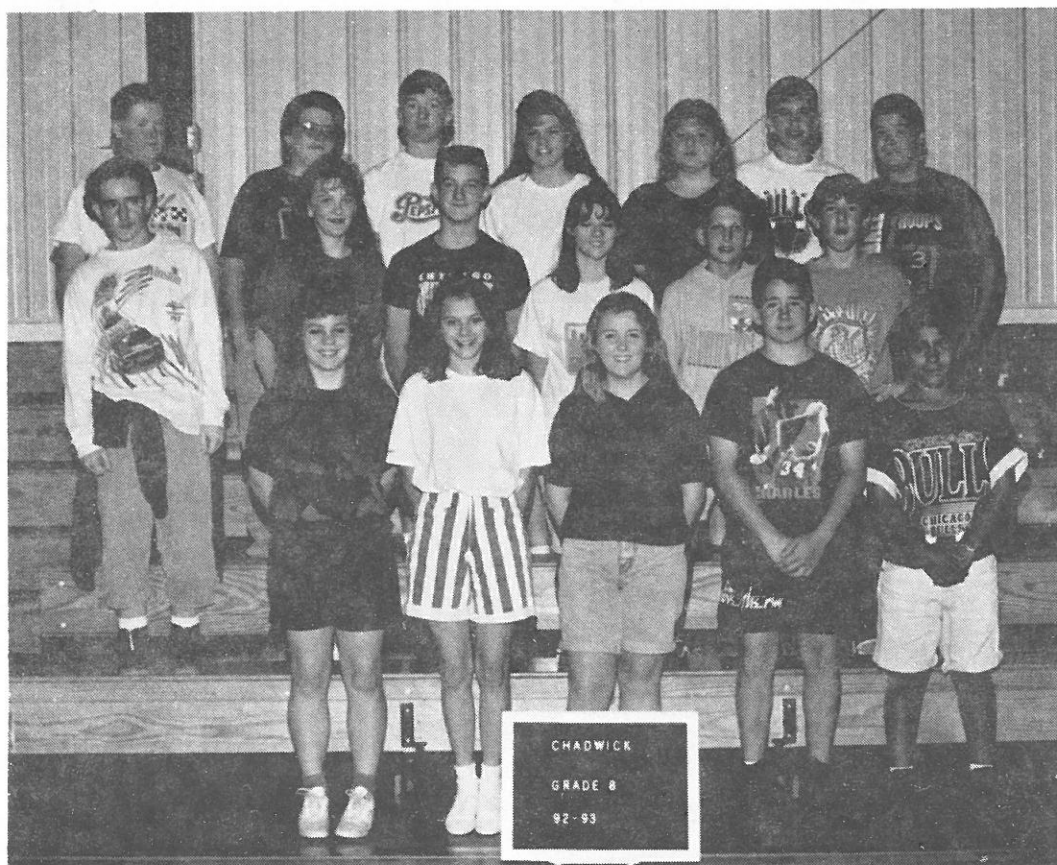
As much as we are all ready to graduate we will never be ready to leave our great friendships we have made through the years.

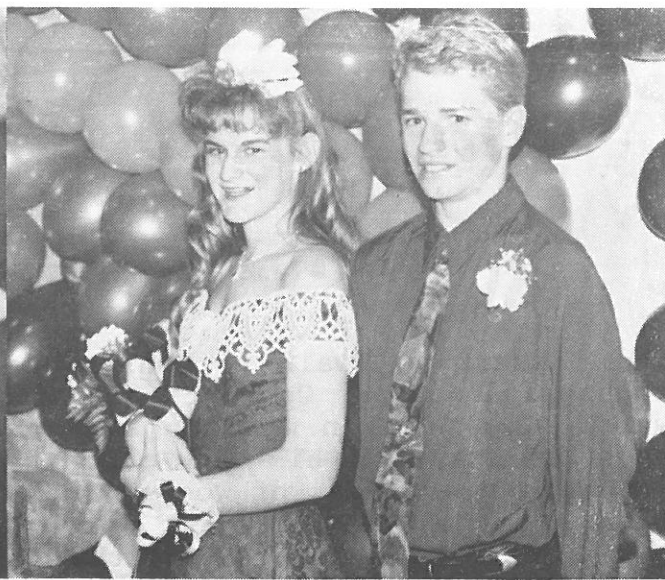

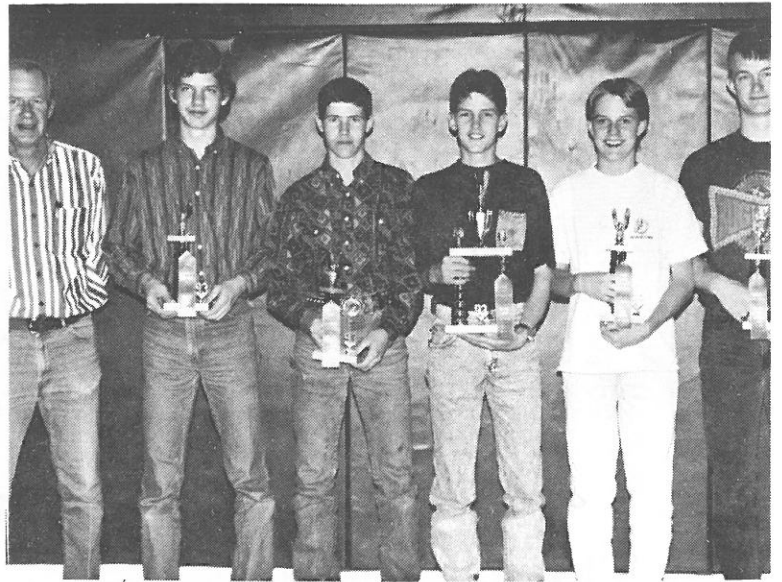

The Science Department has just completed science projects. The winners are listed below:

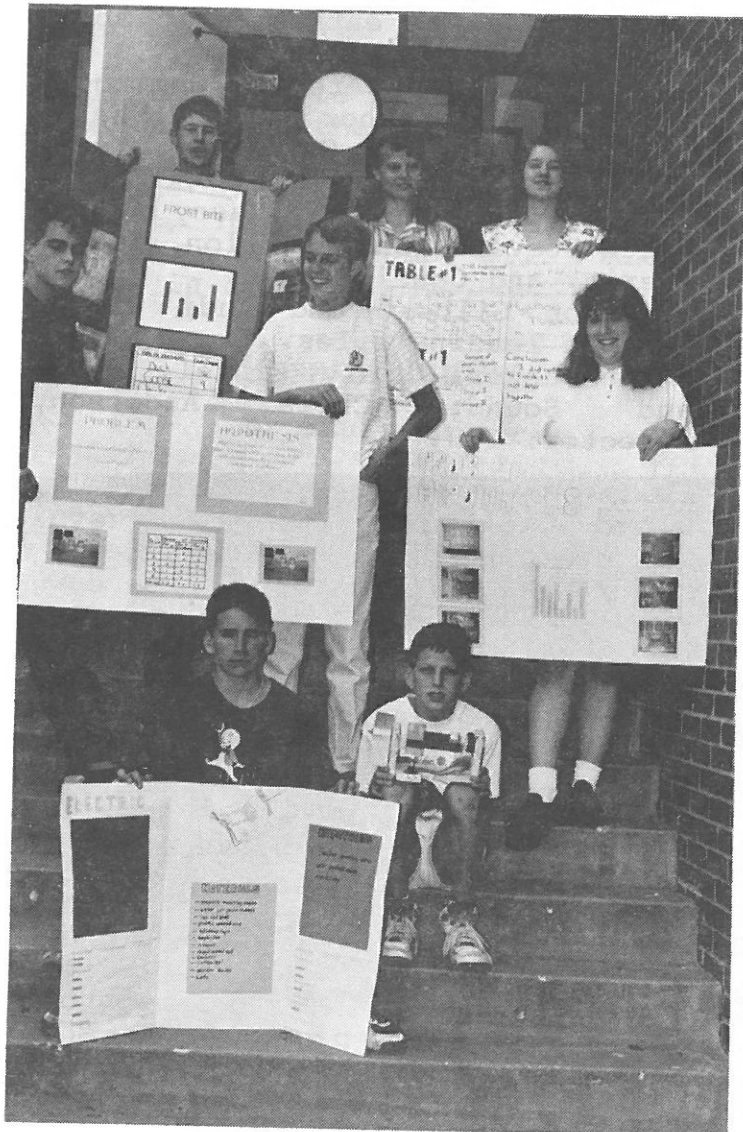
Marvin Guerin tested whether the feathers of water fowl insulate better than land fowl.

Jr. High Volleyball

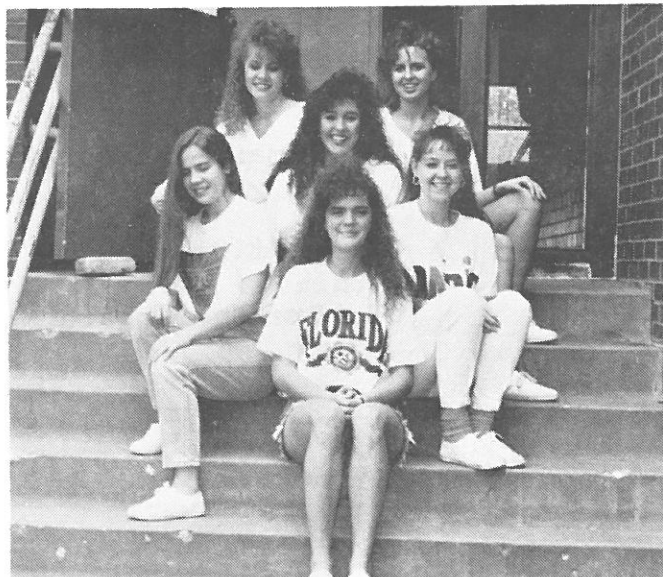

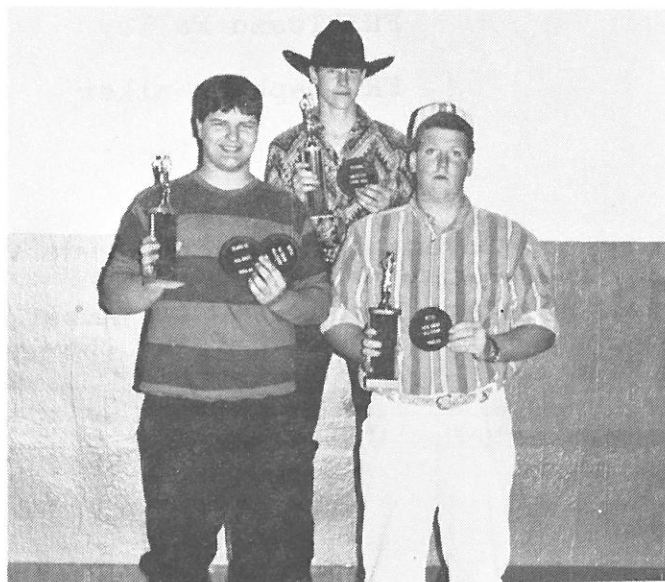

Brandy Maggard - "I'm going to get a job, to save up money for a horse, cause my car never seems to go fast enough."

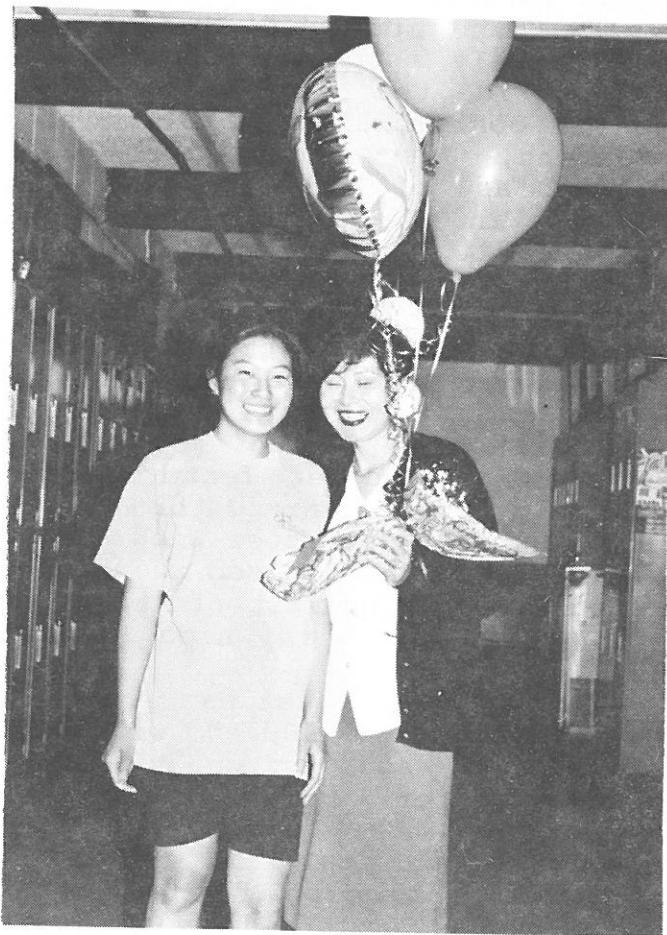
Marvin (Tooter) Guerin - "I'm going to be milking cows this summer, to try to save up for a vehicle."

"Save Our School"

Contributions

Program Success

Last December Chadwick R-1 School Board appointed a contributions committee to direct and coordinate a contributions program for the purpose of increasing ending fund balances for the 1992-93 school year. Due to decreased State and Federal Forest funding the district was classified as financially stressed under a new law enacted in 1992. It was the goal of the district to end the 1992-93 fiscal year with a balance in the general and teachers funds of approximately \$28,988.00 (3% of the previous year's expenses in these funds).

The contributions project has been widely supported both inside and outside the district according to contributions committee chairman, Jerry Rozell. Rozell said, "as of May 6, 1993 the balance in the Contributions Fund was \$21,824.28

According to a report put together by the Contributions Committee some of the main fund raising projects were as follows:

1. Gun Cabinet Raffle by Janice House raised \$1,087.00.

2. A pie supper featuring the Oldfield Opry organized through the Contributions Committee with Janice House as chairman raised \$2,454.50. In addition, a quilt contributed by Mary Jo Burkhart which raised \$1,016.00.

3. Candy sales raised approximately \$1,400.00 with the elementary school candy sales adding another \$555.00.

4. Elementary school valentine project raised approximately \$83.

5. A concert featuring the Wingtips was organized by David and Cammie Guerin. This activity raised a net of \$115.00.

6. The P.T.A. through various activities including the school carnival, donkey ballgame and funds carried over from the previous year's activities contributed a total of \$5,000.00.

7. Basketball tournaments organized by Rick Gilbert and several other community members raised \$2,830.00.

8. An auction of surplus school equipment and donated items raised \$926.00.

9. The alumni cash contributions project organized by Huba Rozell raised in excess of \$7,500.00.

There are still some activities which have not been concluded. These include the donation can project and the P.T.A.'s garage sale which was held on May 8, 1993. There will also be a bicycle raffle to be concluded on Chadwick Railroad Day, June 5, 1993.

Members serving on the Contributions Committee were as follows: Janet Boone, Janice House, Joel Blevins, Diane Guerin, Bert Grove, Marie Day, Jerry Rozell and Ronald Wagner.

According to Superintendent Wagner, "he is very pleased with the tremendous community support received by the school which shows their definite commitment of doing everything possible to maintain education at a high level in the Chadwick district. Budget restraints and financial contributions it appears will result in reaching our financial goals and the continuation of the Chadwick School system. However, if the financially stressed classification is lifted from the district as of the end of the present fiscal year, June 30, 1993, it is very possible that a levy increase may be necessary to replace Proposition C funds."

According to Rozell, board secretary and contributions committee chairman, the purpose of the contributions fund as established in the board minutes is as follows, 'to maintain education, to the extent possible, at the level of the 1992-93 school year and to maintain a fund balance to

comply with Missouri Senate Bill 581'. For the short term this would mean that the contributions fund balance would be maintained for an indefinite period or an emergency situation. At some future time should these funds be needed for a more worthy purpose public hearings would be called to obtain public input for consideration of any new use for the funds.

Elementary Special Education Class Tours Laura Ingalls Wilder Home & Museum

The Special Ed. class did a special reading assignment about the life of the famous frontier author in November of 1992.

They also read some of her books, and watched several movies. The students got so interested and involved that they decided to go to the museum at Mansfield. Since there were no student field trips during regular school days, the class drove over on Saturday, May 1st.

After a tour of the museum and the house where all the "Little House" books were written the group had a picnic in Mansfield.

The class will be doing a lot more of the reading and research in the fall.

Responses from people that have had the opportunity to work with Mr. Mease prove that he will be missed at Chadwick.

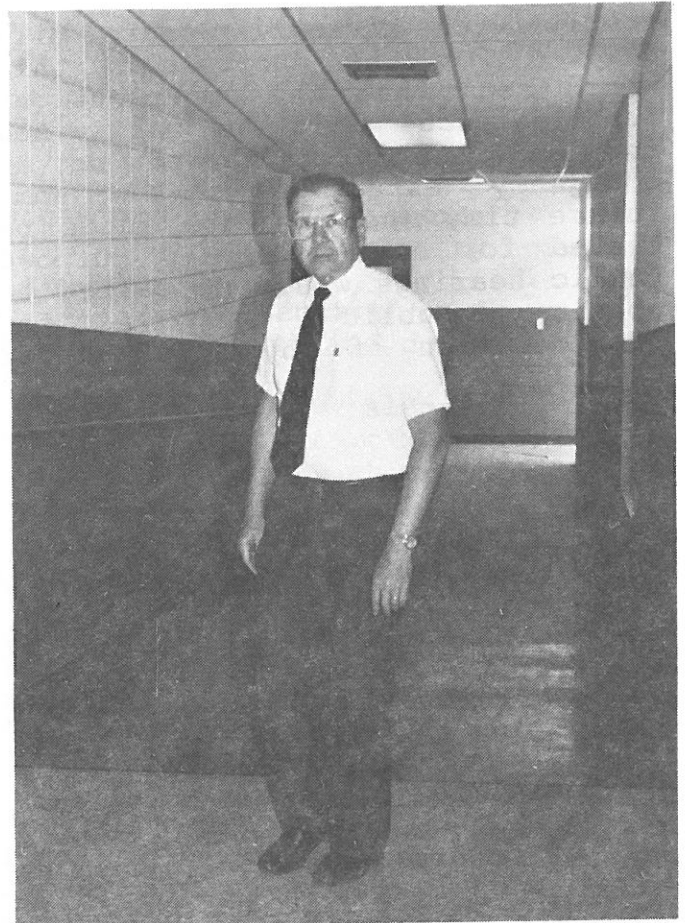
Steve Long, history teacher, commented that he really hates to see him go and he will be missed.
