The building was approved in January of this year, and is being paid for through a lease-purchase program. Construction began over the summer, and the building is expected to be completed and in use before the end of November.


The new building is located directly behind the present school building. It will be accessible through the lunch room. This insures that it will be easy to go between the building and the school in the winter months.

CHADWICK SCHOOL RECEIVES GRANT



Tiffany Peirce—''l went to my Grandma's and ate.''


Cherlyn Burkhart——"I cleaned squirrels all afternoon."

Chadwick Cardinals head into Christmas break on a roll






