"Failing to beat Verona cost us a state ranking," Coach Jester said. But Chadwick rebounded, winning their next eleven games and winning the Spokane Tournament.

Two days after the Spokane Tourney the Cardinals received their first state

ranking in school history at seventh.

"We are very proud (of the ranking) and we are going to do everything we can to keep it the rest of the year," said Coach Jester.

The Cardinals did keep the ranking and improved it, jumping from number seven to number one in two weeks' time. They also defeated Norwood to win the MTC Tourney.

Shortly after, however, when Chadwick faced the Hurley Tigers for the fourth time that season, they were unable to maintain their winning streak. The Cardinals state

"The purpose is to give the district an idea of how they compare to schools all over


the state," said Principal Beasley.




