Jones Named Second Team All-State

Junior LeAnna Jones was named to the 1A girls second team all-state team at the end of basketball season. This is the first time any girl has been named all-state in any sport at Chadwick.

"I was really excited to receive second team all-state," said LeAnna, "I am proud to represent our school and community."

LeAnna will receive an all-state certificate from the Missouri State High School Athletics Association and will also be recognized at this year's athletic banquet May 15.

"It is a great honor for LeAnna to make the all-state team," said Coach Blaue. "It even makes it a greater honor since she is the first girl athlete in any sport to be make an all-state at Chadwick."

Besides being named all-state, LeAnna also earned 1A all-district honors this season and was a member of the KKOZ Dream Team's starting five.

Her stats for this season were: 21.5 pts a game, 6.7 rebounds, 3.5 steals, 2.5 assists, and shot 53% from the field. LeAnna also became the all time leading scorer at Chadwick this season. Jones has scored 1,384 points in her three year career.
