
Eighth grade graduation ceremonies will also take place on May 18th. There are fourteen students graduating from the junior high level into high school.

The 1999 Baseball season is coming to an end with District competition scheduled for May 17-22.


Chadwick is still looking for its elusive first win of the season. Remaining games on the schedule include a home game against Spokane on May 6 and the Seymour tournament May 7-8.




