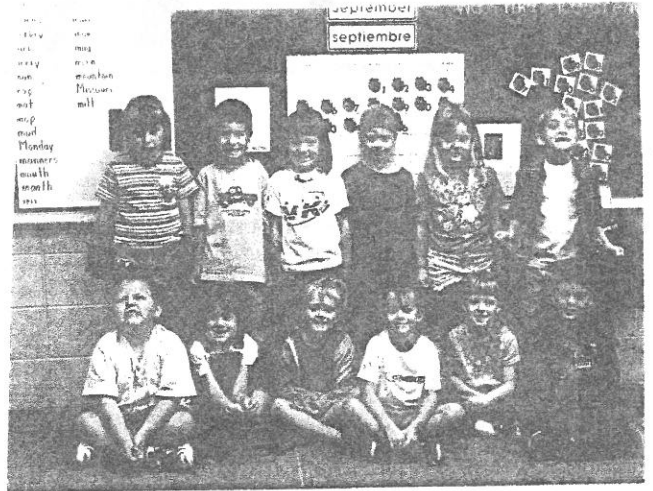

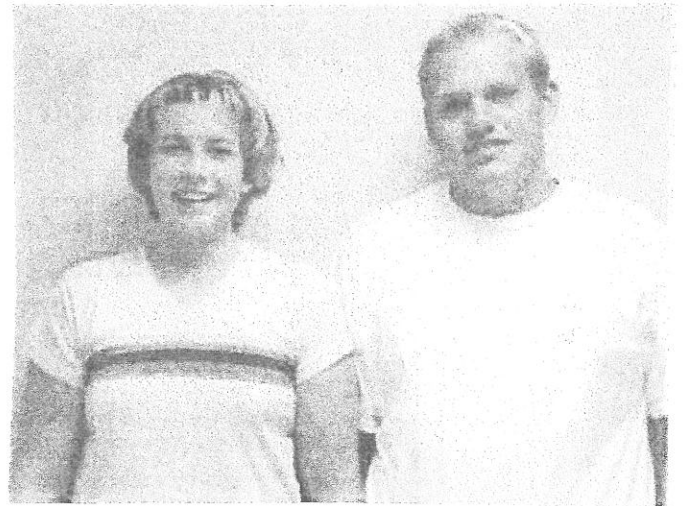
## GO TAKE A LOOK AT WHAT'S NEW

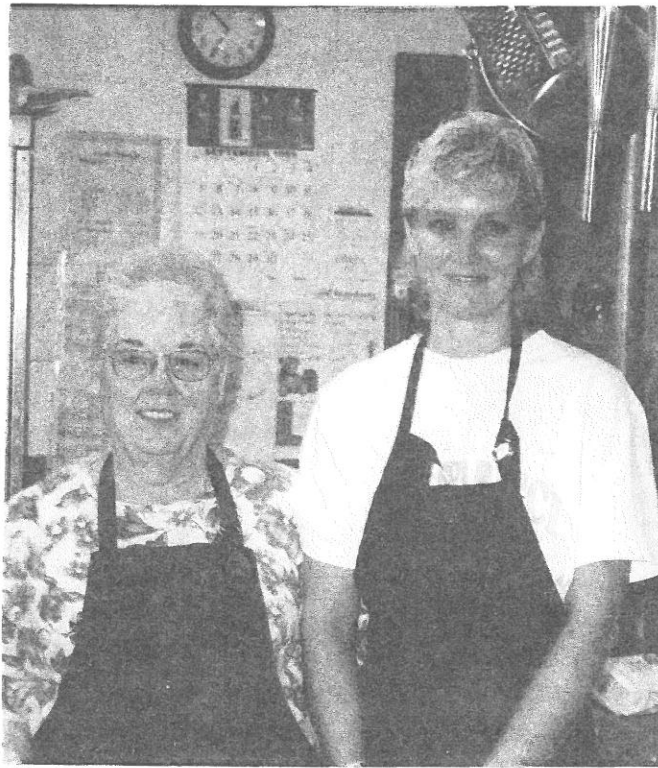

I am pretty sure that there will be lots of kids and candy this year, even if Halloween does come on a Sunday. So everyone have a good time and a scarey, but fun Halloween.



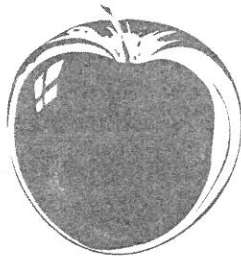


## **New High School Science Teacher at Chadwick**
