10th Grader Abby Payne- Watched the parades and went to her grandmas to eat lunch.


11th Grader Shawn Bordwell- Went to his dads and spent time with friends.

Ryan Adams- I wish everyone had a house.


Mindi Rains- I wish parents wouldn't abuse their children.
