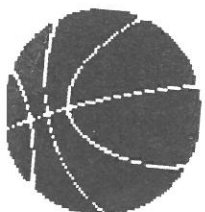
LADY CARDINALS TAKE FIRST

Verona Tournament

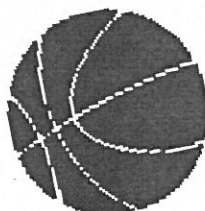
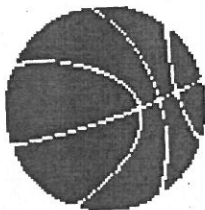
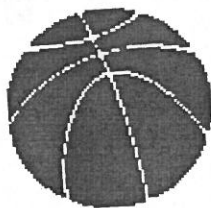
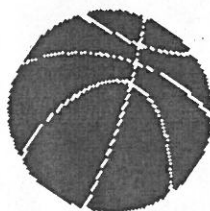
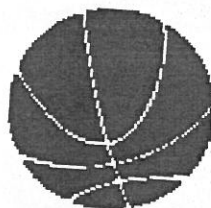
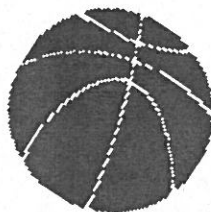

There are lots of things happening around Chadwick either now or in the near future. I will briefly update you on the upcoming events.

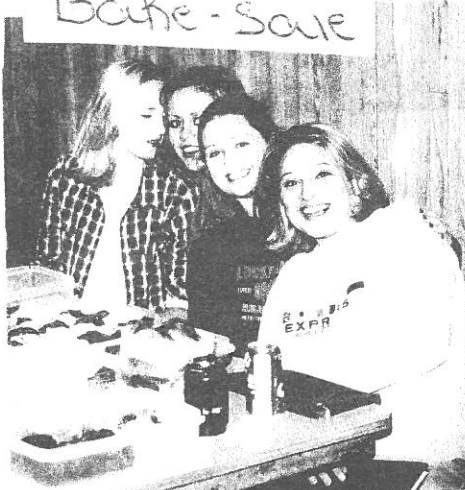
Saturday, December 2, the Junior Class will be hosting a volleyball tournament for fundraising.

November 29, students at Chadwick started taking an achievement test called the "Stanford 9", and that will wrap up on Friday, December 1.

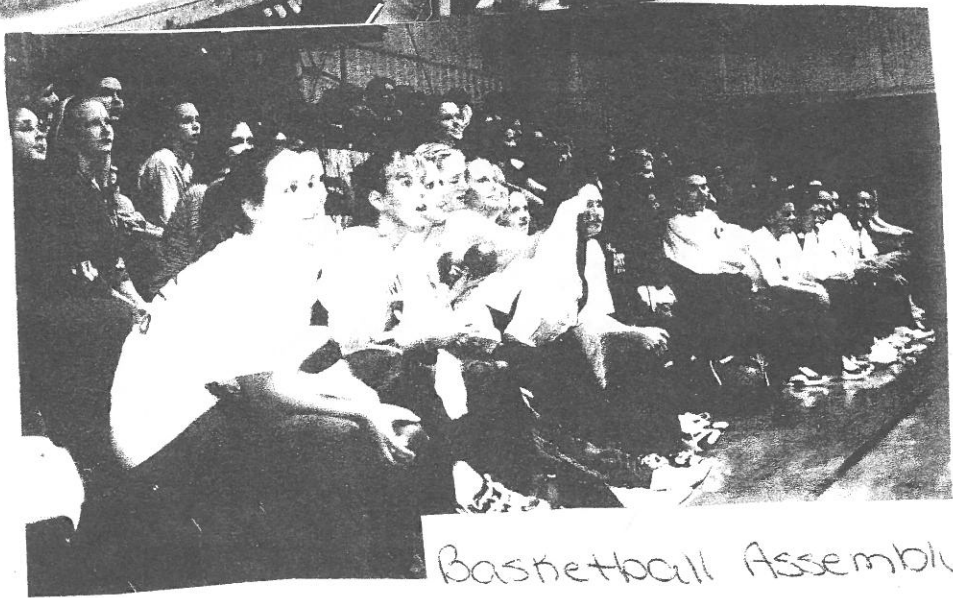
Chadwick has already held their first home basketball game on November 27; and everyone in Chadwick is getting prepared for the holidays. Have a good holiday, but a safe one!

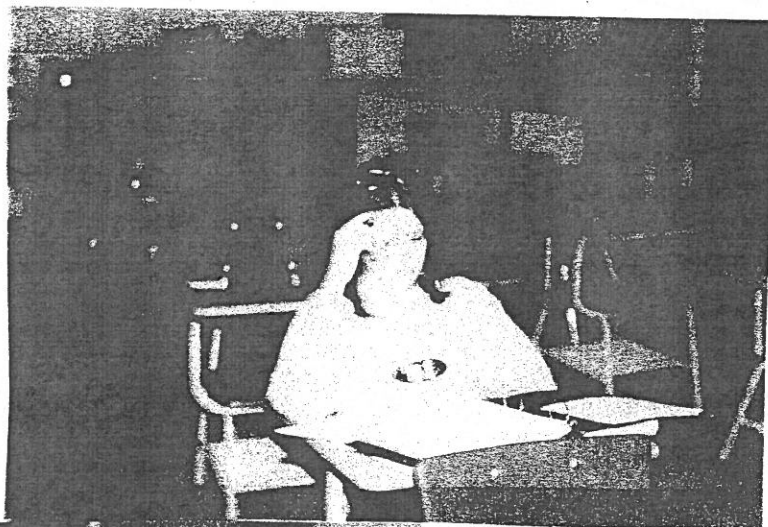

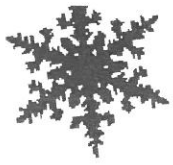
Leaving So Soon??
