We wish the chapter to have a fun filled week.




A Little Fun!

When typing these directions they had a shape that they had to give directions on how to draw. After all the directions were passed around that students had typed, they tried to make the exact shape that was giving in the directions. So see if you can follow Ryan Johnson's directions and draw the exact shape!

- 1. Draw a line four boxes down, label top of line **A** and bottom of line **B**.
- 2. Draw a line horizontally from ${\bf B}$ four spaces label the end of it ${\bf C}$.
- 3. Then draw a vertical line up 4 spaces label the end **D**.
- 4. Draw a line from D to A.
- 5. This should make a square.
- 6. Draw a diagonal line from A to C.
- 7. Draw a diagonal line from **B** to **D**.
- 8. Shade in the bottom triangle that was made; it's the one between points **B** and **C**.
- 9. Then draw a diagonal line 3 boxes down from **D**, label end of line **F**.
- 10. Then draw a diagonal line 3 boxes up from **D** label the end of the line **G**.
- 11. Connect **G** and **F** this should make a triangle.
- 12. From point **F** draw a diagonal dotted line to point **C**.





Gainesville Tourney


