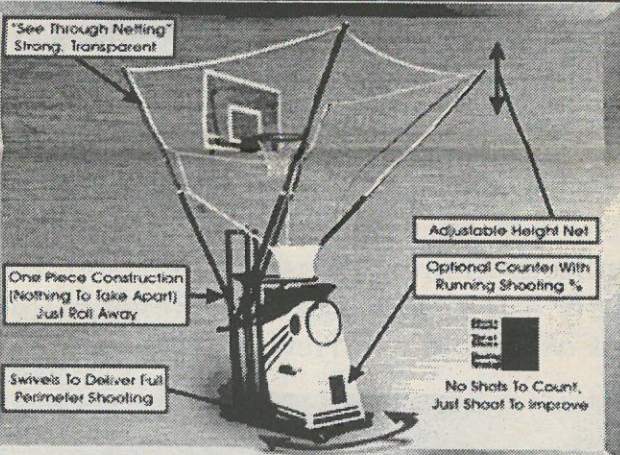

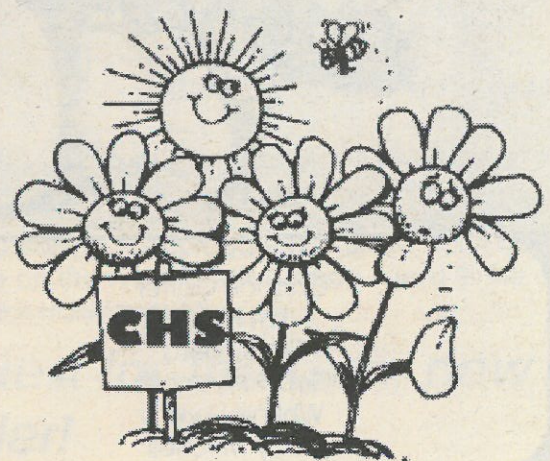

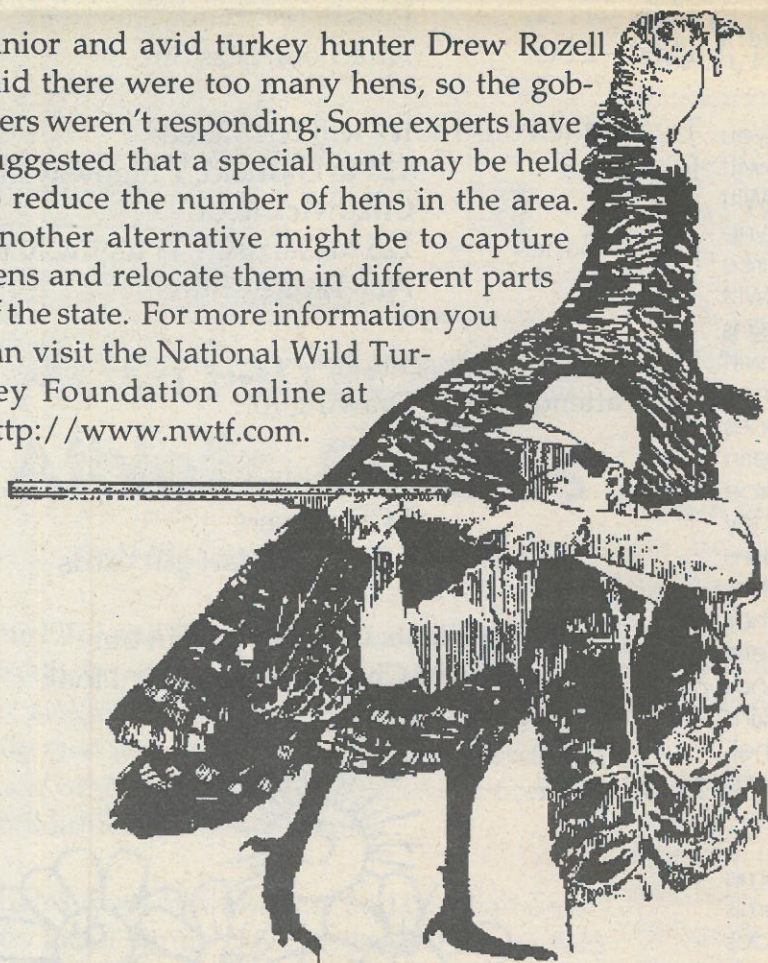
Freshman center Amanda Workman added, "We had a great run, and we 'got 'er done!'"

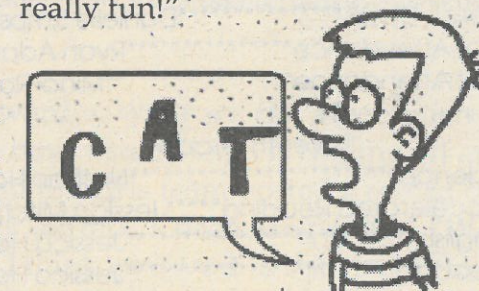
