Lady Cards 3-Peat Rolling Out the Red Carpet

The Lady Cardinals came out with a bang this season, dominating opponents and performing well in tournament play. They won second place in the Walnut Grove Tournament, and they also won the Sparta Tournament for the first time ever.

However, as the team approached districts, the season seemed to be taking a turn for the worse. First, senior Stacey Sisco severely injured her knee. Then, during the first round of the MTC Tournament at Hurley, junior Misty Bettis rebroke her fifth metatarsal. Both starters were sidelined throughout the rest of the tournament, but luckily, the rest of the team was able to step up and take home the MTC Championship.

By the beginning of the District Tournament, Stacey and Misty had reentered the starting lineup, and the team easily defeated the Everton squad. Next, seven three pointers from senior Cassie Lewis guaranteed a win against Golden City, which positioned them to play Exeter in the championship game of the District Tournament. It was a close game, but the Lady Cardinals sank their free throws late in the game to pull ahead for the win.

The team proceeded to Sectionals where they played the Lutie Indians. The Lady Cardinals were behind until late in the fourth quarter when a three point play by Misty helped the team gain momentum for a comeback. Again sinking key free throws, the team finished with a 61-59 victory.

The team was finally stopped by Delta in the Quarterfinal game at the West Plains Civic Center on March 11, leaving the Lady Cardinals with a record of 25-5.

"As a first year coach I could not have had a better situation. These girls have experience, they work hard everyday, and they are great kids.," said Coach Terry Mitchell. "They have taken me on a great ride, and I am thankful to have been a part of their team."

After the junior varsity boys defeated the Hurley Tigers, the boys and girls basketball athletes walked down the red carpet.


