The end of the school year is just around the bend, and everyone knows what that means: summer school!


Chadwick School will be offering summer school for K-6 and an English class for high school credit. Summer school starts Tuesday, May 30, and ends June 23.

The night started off with a slide show presentation dedicated to the seniors.


Senior class vice president Andrew House said, "All the thought they put into the presentation was very appreciated."

New members include junior Colten Jones; and sophomores Brittney Jones, Elizabeth DeWitt, Kathleen Hahn, and Casey Shortt.



"The girls are having a lot of fun," said Coach Mitchell.


Health Fair
