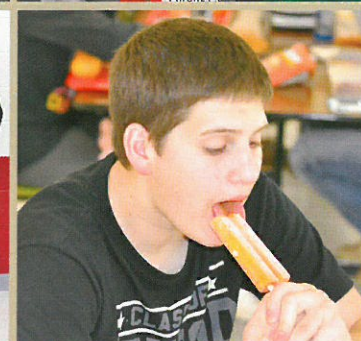
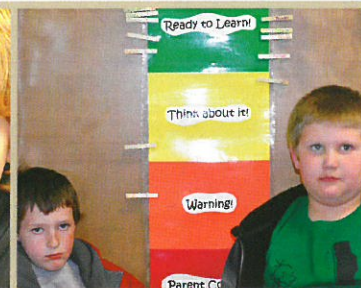
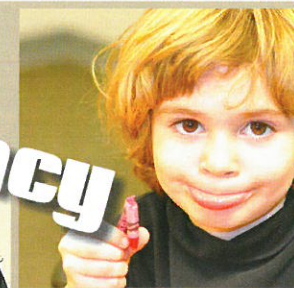
boys vs. girls

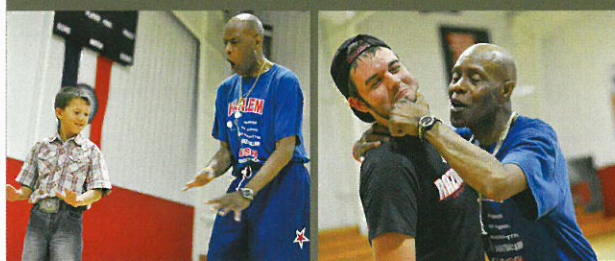

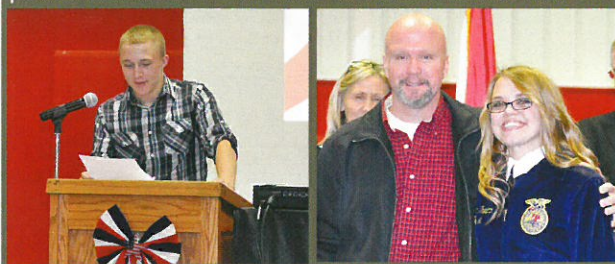

Recess is everyone's favorite part of the day, right? So what could go wrong?

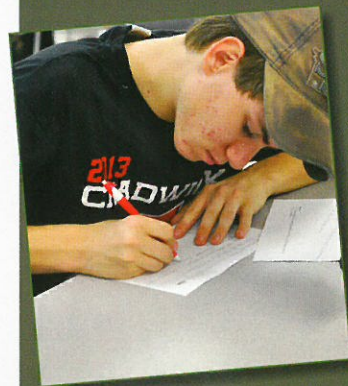

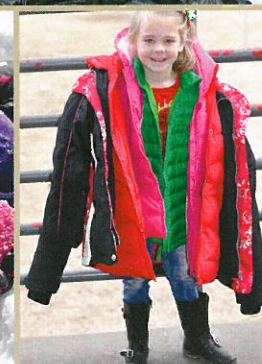
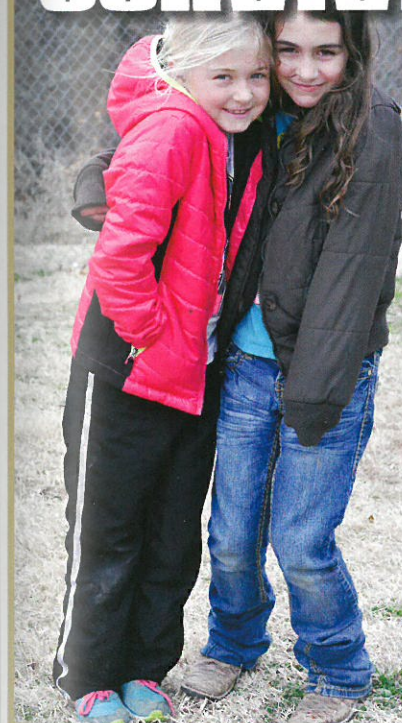

With windchills below zero and over ten inches of snow, students had to bundle up for the December weather. They still managed to have fun, though, especially on the six days they had off to play in the snow.

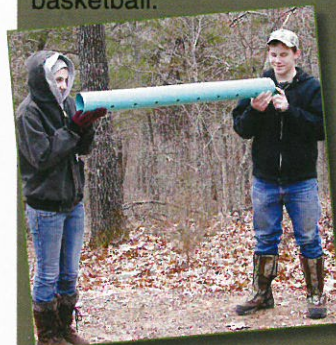

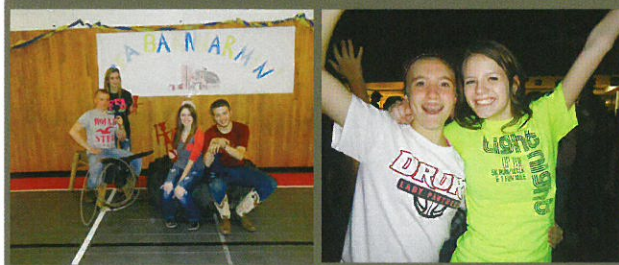

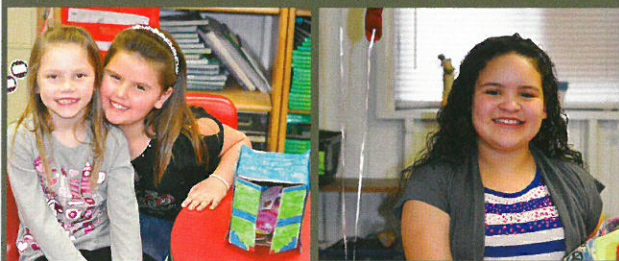

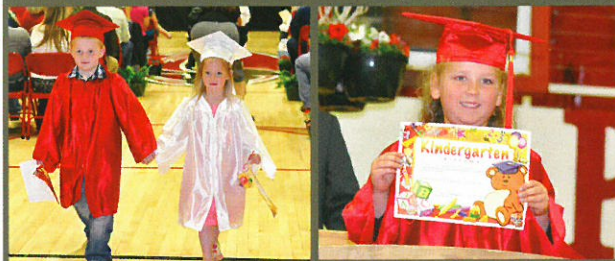

Surviving New Technology

The term "selfie" was added to the dictionary around the beginning of the 2013-14 school year. But even before that, it was an important part of 21st Century vocabulary.

Ask students, and they will tell you taking a good selfie is an essential skill for surviving in their world, which includes not only face-to-face interaction, but lots of time spent in the digital realm on social networks such as Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and Snapchat.



TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL SELFIE

#8 Unless you are going for an extreme close-up, be sure not to hold the camera too close.

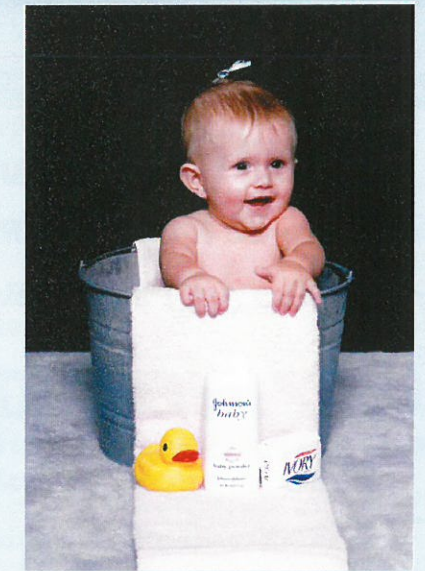
#9 Be aware of the background. For instance, you don't want it to look like you have random objects sprouting from your head.
