























Senior Wills

After losing the first game at Columbia, they ended their season with a win against Marion County to secure a third place finish overall.










TIPS FOR A

#8 Unless you are going for an extreme close-up, be sure not to hold the camera too close.


#9 Be aware of the background. For instance, you don't want it to look like you have random objects sprouting from your head.


