




Senior Wills





Social Distancing: Chadwick Style

In late December 2019, a new strain of coronavirus was discovered in Wuhan, China. The potentially deadly virus, dubbed COVID-19, spread quickly around the globe, and the disease made its way to the U.S. by mid-January.

On the afternoon of March 13, the day that Chadwick students were released for spring break, President Trump declared the outbreak of COVID-19 a national emergency. On Monday, Chadwick School announced that spring break would be extended. By the end of the month, it was determined that, in order to comply with local shelter-in-place orders and federal social distancing guidelines, classes would be dismissed for the remainder of the school year.

Most major events were put on hold, so fans had to rely on video games, reruns of classic matchups, or documentaries.




Time away from others meant more time spent with family during the stay-at-home order.
