On October 29, Project Graduation hosted a seniors vs. faculty volleyball game fundraiser. The staff defeated the seniors, winning two out of three sets.

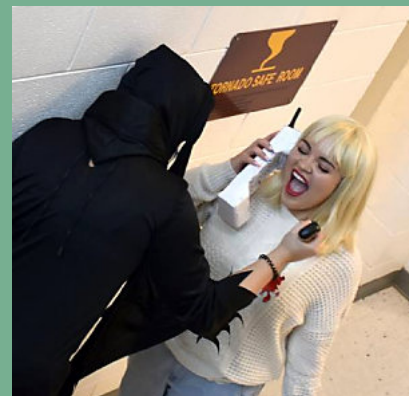

The team placed first among public schools, defeating Hurley 110-30 in the consolation match.

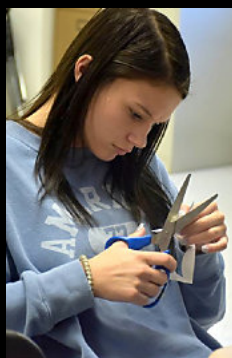
Team captain Katie Sallee said, "I feel like we did really well considering we have so many freshmen this year."

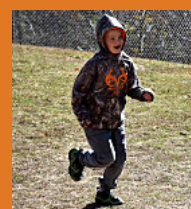

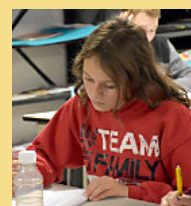

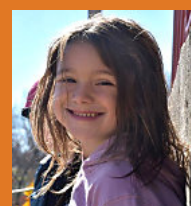

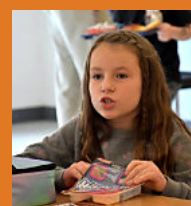

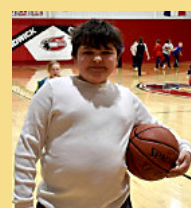

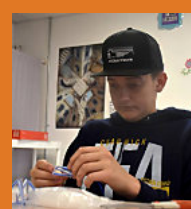
