

First Day of School: Monday, August 22, 2022

The District has created a 2022-2023 comprehensive plan to provide a safe and secure environment for teaching and learning during times of illness. The information below explains our current guidelines for returning to school. Plans are subject to change as circumstances arise, and this guide will be updated with new information as it becomes available. Decisions will be made in coordination with local and state guidelines, and with input from community stakeholders.

▶ Learning Options

- **Option 1:** Traditional in-class learning 5 days per week with safety measures in place.
- **Option 2:** Virtual learning (online).
- The District will make accommodations as necessary or as mandated by an Individualized Education Plan.
- Parents will be responsible for internet service for virtual learning. Lack of consistent internet service will not be an acceptable reason for not completing work. Students working virtually from home will be held to the same standards as seated students at school. Failure to complete work will be reflected in student grades.

NOTE: PACKET LEARNING WILL ONLY BE OFFERED FOR SEATED STUDENTS DURING SCHOOL CLOSURE, QUARANTINE OR EXTENDED ABSENCE DURING ILLNESS.

▶ Health Services/Personal Protective Equipment

- Parents are required to take temperatures and do a health assessment on their children before sending them to school. If your child has a fever of 100 degrees or higher or any other symptoms (including such as cough, fever, sore throat, vomiting, or diarrhea), **please keep them home.**
- The school counselor will assist in the social, emotional, and mental needs of students.
- All staff will perform health assessments on themselves before coming to school.
- Use of personal masks will be allowed.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers will be available throughout the building and frequent hand washing will be encouraged.



▶ Arrival & Dismissal

- Parents/guardians will not be allowed in the building before school unless arranged with administration or faculty beforehand.
- Parents/guardians should remain in their vehicles when dropping off and picking up students.

▶ Breakfast & Lunch

- Students in grades K-4 who are not eating breakfast at school will go directly to their classroom. As students finish eating, they will leave the cafeteria and go to their classroom.
- Students in grades 5-12 who prefer a breakfast tray will eat in the cafeteria, and then go to their designated area in the gym.

▶ Extended Safety Measures

- Tissues and hand sanitizer dispensers will be available throughout the building and frequent handwashing will be encouraged.
- Attendance incentives will be waived.
- Students who appear to be exhibiting two or more symptoms will be sent home.
- Personal water bottles will be encouraged.
- Appropriate disinfecting products will be used to clean frequently touched surfaces daily.
- Our ventilation system will receive increased cleaning and servicing.
- Testing and vaccinations for students are scheduled by parents and caregivers. For staff, the district can assist with scheduling offsite testing and vaccinations. There will be no onsite testing or vaccinations.



▶ **Transportation**

- Seating assignments will be based on loading order and family.
- Hand sanitizer will be available as students board the bus.

▶ **Plan Review and Clarity**

- This plan will be reviewed and any updates will be Board approved at a minimum of every six months.

▶ **Plan Approval**

- Initial plan approval: Regular monthly board meeting, June 14, 2021
- Update approval: Regular monthly board meeting, January 12, 2022
